

# House Bill 4035

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Pre-session filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Business and Labor for Oregon Law Commission)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Amends provisions of Oregon law to conform to changes in Uniform Commercial Code, to clarify meaning of name of debtor, to permit filing of information statement, to adopt official filing forms, to specify priority of competing secured claims and to address related matters. Amendments become operative July 1, 2013.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

2 Relating to secured transactions in personal property; creating new provisions; amending ORS

5 gency.

6 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

7 **SECTION 1.** ORS 79.0102 is amended to read:

8 79.0102. **UCC 9-102. Definitions and index of definitions.** (1) As used in this chapter:

9 (a) "Accession" means goods that are physically united with other goods in such a manner that  
10 the identity of the original goods is not lost.

11 (b) "Account," except as used in "account for":

12 (A) Means a right to payment of a monetary obligation, whether or not earned by performance:

13 (i) For property that has been or is to be sold, leased, licensed, assigned, or otherwise disposed  
14 of;

15 (ii) For services rendered or to be rendered;

16 (iii) For a policy of insurance issued or to be issued;

17 (iv) For a secondary obligation incurred or to be incurred;

18 (v) For energy provided or to be provided;

19 (vi) For the use or hire of a vessel under a charter or other contract;

20 (vii) Arising out of the use of a credit or charge card or information contained on or for use  
21 with the card; or

22 (viii) As winnings in a lottery or other game of chance operated or sponsored by a state, gov-  
23 ernmental unit of a state, or person licensed or authorized to operate the game by a state or gov-  
24 ernmental unit of a state. The term includes health-care-insurance receivables.

25 (B) Does not include:

26 (i) Rights to payment evidenced by chattel paper or an instrument;

27 (ii) Commercial tort claims;

28 (iii) Deposit accounts;

29 (iv) Investment property;

**NOTE:** Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

- 1 (v) Letter-of-credit rights or letters of credit; or
- 2 (vi) Rights to payment for money or funds advanced or sold, other than rights arising out of the
- 3 use of a credit or charge card or information contained on or for use with the card.
- 4 (c)(A) "Account debtor" means a person obligated on an account, chattel paper or general in-
- 5 tangible.
- 6 (B) The term does not include persons obligated to pay a negotiable instrument, even if the in-
- 7 strument constitutes part of chattel paper.
- 8 (d) "Accounting," except as used in "accounting for," means a record:
- 9 (A) Authenticated by a secured party;
- 10 (B) Indicating the aggregate unpaid secured obligations as of a date not more than 35 days
- 11 earlier or 35 days later than the date of the record; and
- 12 (C) Identifying the components of the obligations in reasonable detail.
- 13 (e) "Agricultural lien" means an interest, other than a security interest or a lien created under
- 14 ORS 87.226, 87.228, 87.700 to 87.736 or 87.750 to 87.777, in farm products:
- 15 (A) Which secures payment or performance of an obligation for:
- 16 (i) Goods or services furnished in connection with a debtor's farming operation; or
- 17 (ii) Rent on real property leased by a debtor in connection with its farming operation;
- 18 (B) Which is created by statute in favor of a person that:
- 19 (i) In the ordinary course of its business furnished goods or services to a debtor in connection
- 20 with a debtor's farming operation; or
- 21 (ii) Leased real property to a debtor in connection with the debtor's farming operation; and
- 22 (C) Whose effectiveness does not depend on the person's possession of the personal property.
- 23 (f) "As-extracted collateral" means:
- 24 (A) Oil, gas or other minerals that are subject to a security interest that:
- 25 (i) Is created by a debtor having an interest in the minerals before extraction; and
- 26 (ii) Attaches to the minerals as extracted; or
- 27 (B) Accounts arising out of the sale at the wellhead or minehead of oil, gas or other minerals
- 28 in which the debtor had an interest before extraction.
- 29 (g) "Authenticate" means:
- 30 (A) To sign; or
- 31 (B) *[To execute or otherwise adopt a symbol, or encrypt or similarly process a record in whole or*
- 32 *in part, with the present intent of the authenticating person to identify the person and adopt or accept*
- 33 *a record.]* **With present intent to adopt or accept a record, to attach to or logically associate**
- 34 **with the record an electronic sound, symbol or process.**
- 35 (h) "Bank" means an organization that is engaged in the business of banking. The term includes
- 36 savings banks, savings and loan associations, credit unions and trust companies.
- 37 (i) "Cash proceeds" means proceeds that are money, checks, deposit accounts or the like.
- 38 (j) "Certificate of title" means a certificate of title with respect to which a statute provides for
- 39 the security interest in question to be indicated on the certificate as a condition or result of the
- 40 security interest's obtaining priority over the rights of a lien creditor with respect to the collateral.
- 41 **"Certificate of title" includes another record maintained as an alternative to the certificate**
- 42 **of title by the governmental unit that issues certificates of title if a statute permits the se-**
- 43 **curity interest in question to be indicated on the record as a condition or result of the se-**
- 44 **curity interest's obtaining priority over the rights of the lien creditor with respect to the**
- 45 **collateral.**

1 (k)(A) “Chattel paper” means a record or records that evidence both a monetary obligation and  
 2 a security interest in specific goods, a security interest in specific goods and software used in the  
 3 goods, a security interest in specific goods and license of software used in the goods, a lease of  
 4 specific goods, or a lease of specific goods and license of software used in the goods. In this para-  
 5 graph, “monetary obligation” means a monetary obligation secured by the goods or owed under a  
 6 lease of the goods and includes a monetary obligation with respect to software used in the goods.

7 (B) The term does not include:

8 (i) Charters or other contracts involving the use or hire of a vessel; or

9 (ii) Records that evidence a right to payment arising out of the use of a credit or charge card  
 10 or information contained on or for use with the card. If a transaction is evidenced by records that  
 11 include an instrument or series of instruments, the group of records taken together constitutes  
 12 chattel paper.

13 (L) “Collateral” means the property subject to a security interest or agricultural lien. The term  
 14 includes:

15 (A) Proceeds to which a security interest attaches;

16 (B) Accounts, chattel paper, payment intangibles and promissory notes that have been sold; and

17 (C) Goods that are the subject of a consignment.

18 (m) “Commercial tort claim” means a claim arising in tort with respect to which:

19 (A) The claimant is an organization; or

20 (B) The claimant is an individual and the claim:

21 (i) Arose in the course of the claimant’s business or profession; and

22 (ii) Does not include damages arising out of personal injury to or the death of an individual.

23 (n) “Commodity account” means an account maintained by a commodity intermediary in which  
 24 a commodity contract is carried for a commodity customer.

25 (o) “Commodity contract” means a commodity futures contract, an option on a commodity fu-  
 26 tures contract, a commodity option or another contract if the contract or option is:

27 (A) Traded on or subject to the rules of a board of trade that has been designated as a contract  
 28 market for such a contract pursuant to federal commodities laws; or

29 (B) Traded on a foreign commodity board of trade, exchange, or market, and is carried on the  
 30 books of a commodity intermediary for a commodity customer.

31 (p) “Commodity customer” means a person for which a commodity intermediary carries a com-  
 32 modity contract on its books.

33 (q) “Commodity intermediary” means a person that:

34 (A) Is registered as a futures commission merchant under federal commodities law; or

35 (B) In the ordinary course of its business provides clearance or settlement services for a board  
 36 of trade that has been designated as a contract market pursuant to federal commodities law.

37 (r) “Communicate” means:

38 (A) To send a written or other tangible record;

39 (B) To transmit a record by any means agreed upon by the persons sending and receiving the  
 40 record; or

41 (C) In the case of transmission of a record to or by a filing office, to transmit a record by any  
 42 means prescribed by filing-office rule.

43 (s) “Consignee” means a merchant to which goods are delivered in a consignment.

44 (t) “Consignment” means a transaction, regardless of its form, in which a person delivers goods  
 45 to a merchant for the purpose of sale and:

- 1 (A) The merchant:
- 2 (i) Deals in goods of that kind under a name other than the name of the person making delivery;
- 3 (ii) Is not an auctioneer; and
- 4 (iii) Is not generally known by its creditors to be substantially engaged in selling the goods of
- 5 others;
- 6 (B) With respect to each delivery, the aggregate value of the goods is \$1,000 or more at the time
- 7 of delivery;
- 8 (C) The goods are not consumer goods immediately before delivery; and
- 9 (D) The transaction does not create a security interest that secures an obligation.
- 10 (u) "Consignor" means a person that delivers goods to a consignee in a consignment.
- 11 (v) "Consumer debtor" means a debtor in a consumer transaction.
- 12 (w) "Consumer goods" means goods that are used or bought for use primarily for personal,
- 13 family or household purposes.
- 14 (x) "Consumer-goods transaction" means a consumer transaction in which:
- 15 (A) An individual incurs an obligation primarily for personal, family or household purposes; and
- 16 (B) A security interest in consumer goods secures the obligation.
- 17 (y) "Consumer obligor" means an obligor who is an individual and who incurred the obligation
- 18 as part of a transaction entered into primarily for personal, family or household purposes.
- 19 (z)(A) "Consumer transaction" means a transaction in which:
- 20 (i) An individual incurs an obligation primarily for personal, family or household purposes;
- 21 (ii) A security interest secures the obligation; and
- 22 (iii) The collateral is held or acquired primarily for personal, family or household purposes.
- 23 (B) The term includes consumer-goods transactions.
- 24 (aa) "Continuation statement" means an amendment of a financing statement which:
- 25 (A) Identifies, by its file number, the initial financing statement to which it relates; and
- 26 (B) Indicates that it is a continuation statement for, or that it is filed to continue the effec-
- 27 tiveness of, the identified financing statement.
- 28 (bb) "Debtor" means:
- 29 (A) A person having an interest, other than a security interest or other lien, in the collateral,
- 30 whether or not the person is an obligor;
- 31 (B) A seller of accounts, chattel paper, payment intangibles or promissory notes; or
- 32 (C) A consignee.
- 33 (cc)(A) "Deposit account" means a demand, time, savings, passbook or similar account main-
- 34 tained with a bank.
- 35 (B) The term does not include investment property or accounts evidenced by an instrument.
- 36 (dd) "Document" means a document of title or a receipt of the type described in ORS 77.2010
- 37 (2).
- 38 (ee) "Electronic chattel paper" means chattel paper evidenced by a record or records consisting
- 39 of information stored in an electronic medium.
- 40 (ff) "Encumbrance" means a right, other than an ownership interest, in real property. The term
- 41 includes mortgages and other liens on real property.
- 42 (gg) "Equipment" means goods other than inventory, farm products or consumer goods.
- 43 (hh) "Farm products" means goods, other than standing timber, with respect to which the debtor
- 44 is engaged in a farming operation and which are:
- 45 (A) Crops grown, growing, or to be grown, including:

- 1 (i) Crops produced on trees, vines and bushes; and
- 2 (ii) Aquatic goods produced in aquacultural operations;
- 3 (B) Livestock, born or unborn, including aquatic goods produced in aquacultural operations;
- 4 (C) Supplies used or produced in a farming operation; or
- 5 (D) Products of crops or livestock in their unmanufactured states.
- 6 (ii) "Farming operation" means raising, cultivating, propagating, fattening, grazing or any other
- 7 farming, livestock or aquacultural operation.
- 8 (jj) "File number" means the number assigned to an initial financing statement pursuant to ORS
- 9 79.0519 (1).
- 10 (kk) "Filing office" means an office designated in ORS 79.0501 as the place to file a financing
- 11 statement.
- 12 (LL) "Filing-office rule" means a rule adopted pursuant to ORS 79.0526.
- 13 (mm) "Financing statement" means a record or records composed of an initial financing state-
- 14 ment and any filed record relating to the initial financing statement.
- 15 (nn) "Fixture filing" means the filing of a financing statement covering goods that are or are to
- 16 become fixtures and satisfying ORS 79.0502 (1) and (2). The term includes the filing of a financing
- 17 statement covering goods of a transmitting utility which are or are to become fixtures.
- 18 (oo)(A) "Fixtures" means goods that have become so related to particular real property that an
- 19 interest in them arises under real property law.
- 20 (B) The term does not include portable irrigation equipment including movable pipe, pumps,
- 21 electrical pump panels, pump columns, electrical wire, wheel lines, center pivots and handlines.
- 22 (C) The term includes domestic pumps, domestic pump wire, domestic pump panels, domestic
- 23 pump columns and buried irrigation equipment including buried pipe, buried electrical wire and all
- 24 buried well casings.
- 25 (pp) "General intangible" means any personal property, including things in action, other than
- 26 accounts, chattel paper, commercial tort claims, deposit accounts, documents, goods, instruments,
- 27 investment property, letter-of-credit rights, letters of credit, money and oil, gas or other minerals
- 28 before extraction. The term includes payment intangibles and software.
- 29 (qq)(A) "Goods" means all things that are movable when a security interest attaches.
- 30 (B) The term includes:
- 31 (i) Fixtures;
- 32 (ii) Standing timber that is to be cut and removed under a conveyance or contract for sale;
- 33 (iii) The unborn young of animals;
- 34 (iv) Crops grown, growing or to be grown, even if the crops are produced on trees, vines or
- 35 bushes; and
- 36 (v) Manufactured structures.
- 37 (C) The term also includes a computer program embedded in goods and any supporting infor-
- 38 mation provided in connection with a transaction relating to the program if:
- 39 (i) The program is associated with the goods in such a manner that it customarily is considered
- 40 part of the goods; or
- 41 (ii) By becoming the owner of the goods, a person acquires a right to use the program in con-
- 42 nection with the goods.
- 43 (D) The term does not include a computer program embedded in goods that consist solely of the
- 44 medium in which the program is embedded. The term also does not include accounts, chattel paper,
- 45 commercial tort claims, deposit accounts, documents, general intangibles, instruments, investment

1 property, letter-of-credit rights, letters of credit, money or oil, gas or other minerals before ex-  
2 traction.

3 (rr) "Governmental unit" means a subdivision, agency, department, county, parish, municipality  
4 or other unit of the government of the United States, a state or a foreign country. The term includes  
5 an organization having a separate corporate existence if the organization is eligible to issue debt  
6 on which interest is exempt from income taxation under the laws of the United States.

7 (ss) "Health-care-insurance receivable" means an interest in or claim under a policy of insurance  
8 which is a right to payment of a monetary obligation for health-care goods or services provided.

9 (tt)(A) "Instrument" means a negotiable instrument or any other writing that evidences a right  
10 to the payment of a monetary obligation, is not itself a security agreement or lease, and is of a type  
11 that in ordinary course of business is transferred by delivery with any necessary indorsement or  
12 assignment.

13 (B) The term does not include:

14 (i) Investment property;

15 (ii) Letters of credit; or

16 (iii) Writings that evidence a right to payment arising out of the use of a credit or charge card  
17 or information contained on or for use with the card.

18 (uu) "Inventory" means goods, other than farm products, which:

19 (A) Are leased by a person as lessor;

20 (B) Are held by a person for sale or lease or to be furnished under a contract of service;

21 (C) Are furnished by a person under a contract of service; or

22 (D) Consist of raw materials, work in process, or materials used or consumed in a business.

23 (vv) "Investment property" means a security, whether certificated or uncertificated, security  
24 entitlement, securities account, commodity contract or commodity account.

25 (ww) "Jurisdiction of organization," with respect to a registered organization, means the juris-  
26 diction under whose law the organization is organized.

27 (xx)(A) "Letter-of-credit right" means a right to payment or performance under a letter of credit,  
28 whether or not the beneficiary has demanded or is at the time entitled to demand payment or per-  
29 formance.

30 (B) The term does not include the right of a beneficiary to demand payment or performance  
31 under a letter of credit.

32 (yy) "Lien creditor" means:

33 (A) A creditor that has acquired a lien on the property involved by attachment, levy or the like;

34 (B) An assignee for benefit of creditors from the time of assignment;

35 (C) A trustee in bankruptcy from the date of the filing of the petition; or

36 (D) A receiver in equity from the time of appointment.

37 (zz) "Manufactured structure" has the meaning given that term in ORS 446.561.

38 (aaa) "Manufactured-structure transaction" means a secured transaction:

39 (A) That creates a purchase-money security interest in a manufactured structure, other than a  
40 manufactured structure held as inventory; or

41 (B) In which a manufactured structure, other than a manufactured structure held as inventory,  
42 is the primary collateral.

43 (bbb) "Mortgage" means a consensual interest in real property, including fixtures, which secures  
44 payment or performance of an obligation.

45 (ccc) "New debtor" means a person that becomes bound as debtor under ORS 79.0203 (4) by a

1 security agreement previously entered into by another person.

2 (ddd)(A) “New value” means:

3 (i) Money;

4 (ii) Money’s worth in property, services or new credit; or

5 (iii) Release by a transferee of an interest in property previously transferred to the transferee.

6 (B) The term does not include an obligation substituted for another obligation.

7 (eee) “Noncash proceeds” means proceeds other than cash proceeds.

8 (fff)(A) “Obligor” means a person that, with respect to an obligation secured by a security in-

9 terest in or an agricultural lien on the collateral:

10 (i) Owes payment or other performance of the obligation;

11 (ii) Has provided property other than the collateral to secure payment or other performance of

12 the obligation; or

13 (iii) Is otherwise accountable in whole or in part for payment or other performance of the obli-

14 gation.

15 (B) The term does not include issuers or nominated persons under a letter of credit.

16 (ggg) “Original debtor,” except as used in ORS 79.0310 (3), means a person that, as debtor, en-

17 tered into a security agreement to which a new debtor has become bound under ORS 79.0203 (4).

18 (hhh) “Payment intangible” means a general intangible under which the account debtor’s prin-

19 cipal obligation is a monetary obligation.

20 (iii) “Person related to,” with respect to an individual, means:

21 (A) The spouse of the individual;

22 (B) A brother, brother-in-law, sister or sister-in-law of the individual;

23 (C) An ancestor or lineal descendant of the individual or the individual’s spouse; or

24 (D) Any other relative, by blood or marriage, of the individual or the individual’s spouse who

25 shares the same home with the individual.

26 (jjj) “Person related to,” with respect to an organization, means:

27 (A) A person directly or indirectly controlling, controlled by, or under common control with the

28 organization;

29 (B) An officer or director of, or a person performing similar functions with respect to, the or-

30 ganization;

31 (C) An officer or director of, or a person performing similar functions with respect to, a person

32 described in subparagraph (A) of this paragraph;

33 (D) The spouse of an individual described in subparagraph (A), (B) or (C) of this paragraph; or

34 (E) An individual who is related by blood or marriage to an individual described in subpara-

35 graph (A), (B), (C) or (D) of this paragraph and shares the same home with the individual.

36 (kkk) “Proceeds,” except as used in ORS 79.0609 (2), means the following property:

37 (A) Whatever is acquired upon the sale, lease, license, exchange or other disposition of collat-

38 eral;

39 (B) Whatever is collected on, or distributed on account of, collateral;

40 (C) Rights arising out of collateral;

41 (D) To the extent of the value of collateral, claims arising out of the loss, nonconformity or in-

42 terference with the use of, defects or infringement of rights in, or damage to, the collateral; or

43 (E) To the extent of the value of collateral and to the extent payable to the debtor or the se-

44 cured party, insurance payable by reason of the loss or nonconformity of, defects or infringement

45 of rights in, or damage to, the collateral.

1 (LLL) "Promissory note" means an instrument that evidences a promise to pay a monetary ob-  
 2 ligation, does not evidence an order to pay, and does not contain an acknowledgment by a bank that  
 3 the bank has received for deposit a sum of money or funds.

4 (mmm) "Proposal" means a record authenticated by a secured party which includes the terms  
 5 on which the secured party is willing to accept collateral in full or partial satisfaction of the obli-  
 6 gation it secures pursuant to ORS 79.0620, 79.0621 and 79.0622.

7 (nnn) "Public-finance transaction" means a secured transaction in connection with which:

8 (A) Debt securities are issued;

9 (B) All or a portion of the securities issued have an initial stated maturity of at least 20 years;  
 10 and

11 (C) The debtor, obligor, secured party, account debtor or other person obligated on collateral,  
 12 assignor or assignee of a secured obligation, or assignor or assignee of a security interest is a state  
 13 or a governmental unit of a state.

14 (ooo) "**Public organic record**" means a record that is available to the public for inspection  
 15 and is:

16 (A) **A record consisting of the record initially filed with or issued by a state or the United**  
 17 **States to form or organize an organization and any record filed with or issued by the state**  
 18 **or the United States that amends or restates the initial record;**

19 (B) **An organic record of a business trust consisting of the record initially filed with a**  
 20 **state and any record filed with the state that amends or restates the initial record, if a**  
 21 **statute of the state governing business trusts requires that the record be filed with the**  
 22 **state; or**

23 (C) **A record consisting of legislation enacted by the legislature of a state or the Congress**  
 24 **of the United States that forms or organizes an organization, any record amending the leg-**  
 25 **islation and any record filed with or issued by the state or the United States that amends**  
 26 **or restates the name of the organization.**

27 [(ooo)] (ppp) "Pursuant to commitment," with respect to an advance made or other value given  
 28 by a secured party, means pursuant to the secured party's obligation, whether or not a subsequent  
 29 event of default or other event not within the secured party's control has relieved or may relieve  
 30 the secured party from its obligation.

31 [(ppp)] (qqq) "Record," except as used in "for record," "of record," "record or legal title" and  
 32 "record owner," means information that is inscribed on a tangible medium or which is stored in an  
 33 electronic or other medium and is retrievable in perceivable form.

34 [(qqq)] (rrr) "Registered organization" means an organization **formed or** organized solely under  
 35 the law of a single state or the United States [*and as to which the state or the United States is re-*  
 36 *quired by statute or regulation to maintain a public record showing the organization to have been or-*  
 37 *ganized.*] **by the filing of a public organic record with, the issuance of a public organic record**  
 38 **by or the enactment of legislation by the state or the United States. "Registered**  
 39 **organization" includes a business trust that is formed or organized under the law of a single**  
 40 **state if a statute of the state governing business trusts requires that the business trust's**  
 41 **organic record be filed with the state.**

42 [(rrr)] (sss) "Secondary obligor" means an obligor to the extent that:

43 (A) The obligor's obligation is secondary; or

44 (B) The obligor has a right of recourse with respect to an obligation secured by collateral  
 45 against the debtor, another obligor, or property of either.



1 [(sss)] **(ttt)** “Secured party” means:

2 (A) A person in whose favor a security interest is created or provided for under a security  
3 agreement, whether or not any obligation to be secured is outstanding;

4 (B) A person that holds an agricultural lien;

5 (C) A consignor;

6 (D) A person to which accounts, chattel paper, payment intangibles or promissory notes have  
7 been sold;

8 (E) A trustee, indenture trustee, agent, collateral agent or other representative in whose favor  
9 a security interest or agricultural lien is created or provided for; or

10 (F) A person that holds a security interest arising under ORS 72.4010, 72.5050, 72.7110 (3),  
11 72A.5080 (5), 74.2100 or 75.1180.

12 [(ttt)] **(uuu)** “Security agreement” means an agreement that creates or provides for a security  
13 interest.

14 [(uuu)] **(vvv)** “Send,” in connection with a record or notification, means:

15 (A) To deposit in the mail, deliver for transmission, or transmit by any other usual means of  
16 communication, with postage or cost of transmission provided for, addressed to any address reason-  
17 able under the circumstances; or

18 (B) To cause the record or notification to be received within the time that it would have been  
19 received if properly sent under subparagraph (A) of this paragraph.

20 [(vvv)(A)] **(www)(A)** “Software” means a computer program and any supporting information  
21 provided in connection with a transaction relating to the program.

22 (B) The term does not include a computer program that is included in the definition of goods.

23 [(www)] **(xxx)** “State” means a state of the United States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico,  
24 the United States Virgin Islands or any territory or insular possession subject to the jurisdiction  
25 of the United States.

26 [(xxx)] **(yyy)** “Supporting obligation” means a letter-of-credit right or secondary obligation that  
27 supports the payment or performance of an account, chattel paper, a document, a general intangible,

30 consisting of information that is inscribed on a tangible medium.

31 [(zzz)] **(aaa)** “Termination statement” means an amendment of a financing statement which:

32 (A) Identifies, by its file number, the initial financing statement to which it relates; and

33 (B) Indicates either that it is a termination statement or that the identified financing statement  
34 is no longer effective.

35 [(aaa)] **(bbb)** “Transmitting utility” means an organization primarily engaged in the business  
36 of:

37 (A) Operating a railroad, subway, street railway or trolley bus;

38 (B) Transmitting communications electrically, electromagnetically or by light;

39 (C) Transmitting goods by pipeline or sewer; or

40 (D) Transmitting or producing and transmitting electricity, steam, gas or water.

8 (8) The United States is located in the District of Columbia.

9 (9) A branch or agency of a bank that is not organized under the law of the United States or  
 10 a state is located in the state in which the branch or agency is licensed, if all branches and agencies  
 11 of the bank are licensed in only one state.

12 (10) A foreign air carrier under the Federal Aviation Act of 1958, as amended, is located at the  
 13 designated office of the agent upon which service of process may be made on behalf of the carrier.

14 (11) This section applies only for purposes of ORS 79.0301 to 79.0342.

15 **SECTION 5.** ORS 79.0311 is amended to read:

16 79.0311. **UCC 9-311. Perfection of security interests in property subject to certain statutes,**  
 17 **regulations and treaties.** (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (4) of this section, the  
 18 filing of a financing statement is not necessary or effective to perfect a security interest in property  
 19 subject to:

20 (a) A statute, regulation or treaty of the United States whose requirements for a security  
 21 interest's obtaining priority over the rights of a lien creditor with respect to the property preempt  
 22 ORS 79.0310 (1);

23 (b) ORS chapter 830 and the Oregon Vehicle Code;

24 (c) A [*certificate-of-title*] statute of another jurisdiction [*which*] **that** provides for a security in-  
 25 terest to be indicated on [*the*] **a certificate of title** as a condition or result of the security interest's  
 26 obtaining priority over the rights of a lien creditor with respect to the property; or

27 (d) ORS 446.611 (1).

28 (2) Compliance with the requirements of a statute, regulation or treaty described in subsection  
 29 (1) of this section for obtaining priority over the rights of a lien creditor is equivalent to the filing  
 30 of a financing statement under this chapter. Except as otherwise provided in subsection (4) of this  
 31 section and ORS 79.0313, 79.0316 (4) and (5) and 79.0334 for goods covered by a certificate of title

1        79.0316. **UCC 9-316. Effect of change in governing law.** (1) A security interest perfected pur-  
 2        suant to the law of the jurisdiction designated in ORS 79.0301 (1) or 79.0305 (3) remains perfected  
 3        until the earliest of:

4        (a) The time perfection would have ceased under the law of that jurisdiction;

5        (b) The expiration of four months after a change of the debtor's location to another jurisdiction;

7        (c) The expiration of one year after a transfer of collateral to a person that thereby becomes a  
 8        debtor and is located in another jurisdiction.

9        (2) If a security interest described in subsection (1) of this section becomes perfected under the

36       (6) A security interest in deposit accounts, letter-of-credit rights or investment property which

 39       as applicable, remains perfected until the earlier of:

40       (a) The time the security interest would have become unperfected under the law of that juris-

42       (b) The expiration of four months after a change of the applicable jurisdiction to another juris-

44       (7) If a security interest described in subsection (6) of this section becomes perfected under the  
 45       law of the other jurisdiction before the earlier of the time or the end of the period described in

1 subsection (6) of this section, it remains perfected thereafter. If the security interest does not be-  
 2 come perfected under the law of the other jurisdiction before the earlier of that time or the end of  
 3 that period, it becomes unperfected and is deemed never to have been perfected as against a pur-

5 **(8) The following rules apply to collateral to which a security interest attaches within**

7 **(a) A financing statement filed before the change pursuant to the law of the jurisdiction**

 9 **collateral if the financing statement would have been effective to perfect a security interest**  
 10 **in the collateral had the debtor not changed the debtor's location.**

11 **(b) If a security interest perfected by a financing statement that is effective under par-**  
 12 **agraph (a) of this subsection becomes perfected under the law of the other jurisdiction before**  
 13 **the earlier of the time the financing statement would have become ineffective under the law**  
 14 **of the jurisdiction designated in ORS 79.0301 (1) or 79.0305 (3), or the expiration of the four-**  
 15 **month period, it remains perfected thereafter. If the security interest does not become per-**  
 16 **fected under the law of the other jurisdiction before the earlier time or event, it becomes**  
 17 **unperfected and is deemed never to have been perfected as against a purchaser of the**  
 18 **collateral for value.**

19 **(9) If a financing statement naming an original debtor is filed pursuant to the law of the**  
 20 **jurisdiction designated in ORS 79.0301 (1) or 79.0305 (3) and the new debtor in another juris-**  
 21 **isdiction, the following rules apply:**

22 **(a) The financing statement is effective to perfect a security interest in collateral ac-**  
 23 **quired by the new debtor before, and within four months after, the new debtor becomes**  
 24 **bound under ORS 79.0203 (4) if the financing statement would have been effective to perfect**  
 25 **a security interest in the collateral had the collateral been acquired by the original debtor.**

26 **(b) A security interest perfected by the financing statement and that becomes perfected**  
 27 **under the law of the other jurisdiction before the earlier of the time the financing statement**  
 28 **would have become ineffective under the law of the jurisdiction designated in ORS 79.0301 (1)**  
 29 **or 79.0305 (3), or the expiration of the four-month period, remains perfected thereafter. A**  
 30 **security interest that is perfected by the financing statement but that does not become**  
 31 **perfected under the law of the other jurisdiction before the earlier time or event becomes**  
 32 **unperfected and is deemed never to have been perfected as against a purchaser of the**  
 33 **collateral for value.**

34 **SECTION 7.** ORS 79.0317 is amended to read:

35 **79.0317. UCC 9-317. Interests that take priority over or take free of security interest or**  
 36 **agricultural lien.** (1) A security interest or agricultural lien is subordinate to the rights of:

37 (a) A person entitled to priority under ORS 79.0322; and

38 (b) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (5) of this section, a person that becomes a lien  
 39 creditor before the earlier of the time:

40 (A) The security interest or agricultural lien is perfected; or

41 (B) One of the conditions specified in ORS 79.0203 (2)(c) is met and a financing statement cov-  
 42 ering the collateral is filed.

43 (2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (5) of this section, a buyer, other than a secured  
 44 party, of tangible chattel paper, tangible documents, goods, instruments or a **certificated** security  
 45 [*certificate*] takes free of a security interest or agricultural lien if the buyer gives value and receives

1 delivery of the collateral without knowledge of the security interest or agricultural lien and before  
2 it is perfected.

3 (3) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (5) of this section, a lessee of goods takes free  
4 of a security interest or agricultural lien if the lessee gives value and receives delivery of the  
5 collateral without knowledge of the security interest or agricultural lien and before it is perfected.

6 (4) A licensee of a general intangible or a buyer, other than a secured party, of [*accounts, elec-*  
7 *tronic chattel paper, electronic documents, general intangibles or investment property*] **collateral** other  
8 than **tangible chattel paper, tangible documents, goods, instruments or** a certificated security  
9 takes free of a security interest if the licensee or buyer gives value without knowledge of the se-  
10 curity interest and before it is perfected.

11 (5) Except as otherwise provided in ORS 79.0320 and 79.0321, if a person files a financing  
12 statement with respect to a purchase-money security interest before or within 20 days after the  
13 debtor receives delivery of the collateral, the security interest takes priority over the rights of a  
14 buyer, lessee or lien creditor which arise between the time the security interest attaches and the  
15 time of filing.

16 **SECTION 8.** ORS 79.0326 is amended to read:

17 79.0326. **UCC 9-326. Priority of security interests created by new debtor.** (1) Subject to  
18 subsection (2) of this section, a security interest **that is** created by a new debtor [*which is*] **in**  
19 **collateral in which the new debtor has or acquires rights and is** perfected **solely** by a filed fi-  
20 nancing statement that [*is effective solely under ORS 79.0508 in collateral in which a new debtor has*  
21 *or acquires rights*] **would be ineffective to perfect the security interest but for the application**  
22 **of ORS 79.0316 (9)(a) or 79.0508** is subordinate to a security interest in the same collateral which  
23 is perfected other than by **such** a filed financing statement [*that is effective solely under ORS*  
24 *79.0508*].

25 (2) The other provisions of ORS 79.0301 to 79.0342 determine the priority among conflicting se-  
26 curity interests in the same collateral perfected by filed financing statements [*that are effective solely*

28 ments to which a new debtor became bound as debtor were not entered into by the same original

32 79.0335. **UCC 9-335. Accessions.** (1) A security interest may be created in an accession and  
33 continues in collateral that becomes an accession.

34 (2) If a security interest is perfected when the collateral becomes an accession, the security in-  
35 terest remains perfected in the collateral.

36 (3) Except as otherwise provided in subsections (4) and (7) of this section, the other provisions  
37 of ORS 79.0301 to 79.0342 determine the priority of a security interest in an accession.

38 (4) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (7) of this section, a security interest in an ac-  
39 cession is subordinate to a security interest in the whole which is perfected by compliance with [*the*  
40 *requirements of a certificate-of-title statute under*] ORS 79.0311 (2), [*or with ORS*] 446.611 or 446.626.

41 (5) After default, subject to ORS 79.0601 to 79.0628, a secured party may remove an accession  
42 from other goods if the security interest in the accession has priority over the claims of every per-  
43 son having an interest in the whole.

44 (6) A secured party that removes an accession from other goods under subsection (5) of this  
45 section shall promptly reimburse any holder of a security interest or other lien on, or owner of, the



1 whole or of the other goods, other than the debtor, for the cost of repair of any physical injury to  
 2 the whole or the other goods. The secured party need not reimburse the holder or owner for any  
 3 diminution in value of the whole or the other goods caused by the absence of the accession removed  
 4 or by any necessity for replacing it. A person entitled to reimbursement may refuse permission to

7 (7) A security interest in an accession has priority over a security interest in the whole which

 10 curity interest that is perfected when the debtor receives possession of the accession or within 20

12 **SECTION 10.** ORS 79.0406 is amended to read:

13 79.0406. **UCC 9-406. Discharge of account debtor; notification of assignment; identification**  
 14 **and proof of assignment; restrictions on assignment of accounts, chattel paper, payment in-**  
 15 **tangibles and promissory notes ineffective.** (1) Subject to subsections (2) to (9) of this section,  
 16 an account debtor on an account, chattel paper or a payment intangible may discharge its obligation  
 17 by paying the assignor until, but not after, the account debtor receives a notification, authenticated  
 18 by the assignor or the assignee, that the amount due or to become due has been assigned and that  
 19 payment is to be made to the assignee. After receipt of the notification, the account debtor may  
 20 discharge its obligation by paying the assignee and may not discharge the obligation by paying the  
 21 assignor.

22 (2) Subject to subsection (8) of this section, notification is ineffective under subsection (1) of this

24 (a) If it does not reasonably identify the rights assigned;

25 (b) To the extent that an agreement between an account debtor and a seller of a payment in-  
 26 tangible limits the account debtor's duty to pay a person other than the seller and the limitation is  
 27 effective under law other than this chapter; or

28 (c) At the option of an account debtor, if the notification notifies the account debtor to make  
 29 less than the full amount of any installment or other periodic payment to the assignee, even if:

30 (A) Only a portion of the account, chattel paper or payment intangible has been assigned to that  
 31 assignee;

32 (B) A portion has been assigned to another assignee; or

33 (C) The account debtor knows that the assignment to that assignee is limited.

34 (3) Subject to subsection (8) of this section, if requested by the account debtor, an assignee shall  
 35 seasonably furnish reasonable proof that the assignment has been made. Unless the assignee com-  
 36 plies, the account debtor may discharge its obligation by paying the assignor, even if the account

[(2) A filing office that accepts written records may not refuse to accept a written record in the form and format set forth in the final official text of the 1999 revisions to Article 9 of the Uniform Commercial Code promulgated by The American Law Institute and the National Conference of Commissioners on Uniform State Laws, except for a reason set forth in ORS 79.0516 (2).]

**SECTION 18.** ORS 79.0607 is amended to read:

79.0607. **UCC 9-607. Collection and enforcement by secured party.** (1) If so agreed, and in any event after default, a secured party:

(a) May notify an account debtor or other person obligated on collateral to make payment or otherwise render performance to or for the benefit of the secured party;

(b) May take any proceeds to which the secured party is entitled under ORS 79.0315;

(c) May enforce the obligations of an account debtor or other person obligated on collateral and exercise the rights of the debtor with respect to the obligation of the account debtor or other person obligated on collateral to make payment or otherwise render performance to the debtor, and with respect to any property that secures the obligations of the account debtor or other person obligated on the collateral;

(d) If it holds a security interest in a deposit account perfected by control under ORS 79.0104 (1)(a), may apply the balance of the deposit account to the obligation secured by the deposit account; and

1 (e) If it holds a security interest in a deposit account perfected by control under ORS 79.0104  
 2 (1)(b) or (c), may instruct the bank to pay the balance of the deposit account to or for the benefit  
 3 of the secured party.

4 (2) If necessary to enable a secured party to exercise under subsection (1)(c) of this section the  
 5 right of a debtor to enforce a mortgage nonjudicially, the secured party may record in the office in  
 6 which a record of the mortgage is recorded the secured party's sworn affidavit, with a copy of the  
 7 security agreement attached thereto. The affidavit shall be in recordable form and state that:

8 (a) A default has occurred **with respect to the obligation secured by the mortgage**; and

9 (b) The secured party is entitled to enforce the mortgage nonjudicially.

10 (3) A secured party shall proceed in a commercially reasonable manner if the secured party:

11 (a) Undertakes to collect from or enforce an obligation of an account debtor or other person  
 12 obligated on collateral; and

13 (b) Is entitled to charge back uncollected collateral or otherwise to full or limited recourse  
 14 against the debtor or a secondary obligor.

15 (4) A secured party may deduct from the collections made pursuant to subsection (3) of this  
 16 section reasonable expenses of collection and enforcement, including reasonable attorney fees and  
 17 legal expenses incurred by the secured party.

18 (5) This section does not determine whether an account debtor, bank or other person obligated  
 19 on collateral owes a duty to a secured party.

20 **SECTION 19.** ORS 79.0619 is amended to read:

21 79.0619. **UCC 9-619. Transfer of record or legal title.** (1) As used in this section, "transfer  
 22 statement" means a record authenticated by a secured party stating:

23 (a) That the debtor has defaulted in connection with an obligation secured by specified collat-  
 24 eral;

25 (b) That the secured party has exercised its post-default remedies with respect to the collateral;

26 (c) That, by reason of the exercise, a transferee has acquired the rights of the debtor in the  
 27 collateral; and

28 (d) The name and mailing address of the secured party, debtor and transferee.

29 (2) A transfer statement entitles the transferee to the transfer of record of all rights of the  
 30 debtor in the collateral specified in the statement in any official **system for** filing, recording[, *reg-*  
 31 *istration or certificate-of-title system*] **or registration** covering the collateral **or in accordance with**  
 32 **the provisions of ORS 79.0311 (2), 446.611 or 446.626.** If a transfer statement is presented with the  
 33 applicable fee and request form to the official or office responsible for maintaining the system, the  
 34 official or office shall:

35 (a) Accept the transfer statement;

36 (b) Promptly amend its records to reflect the transfer; and

37 (c) If applicable, issue a new appropriate certificate of title in the name of the transferee.

38 (3) A transfer of the record or legal title to collateral to a secured party under subsection (2)  
 39 of this section or otherwise is not of itself a disposition of collateral under this chapter and does  
 40 not of itself relieve the secured party of its duties under this chapter.

41 **SECTION 20.** (1) **Except as otherwise provided in sections 20 to 27 of this 2012 Act, the**  
 42 **amendments to statutes by sections 1 to 19 of this 2012 Act apply to a transaction or lien**  
 43 **within the scope of ORS 79.0102, 79.0105, 79.0208, 79.0307, 79.0311, 79.0316, 79.0317, 79.0326,**  
 44 **79.0335, 79.0406, 79.0408, 79.0503, 79.0507, 79.0515, 79.0516, 79.0518, 79.0521, 79.0607 and 79.0619,**  
 45 **as amended by sections 1 to 19 of this 2012 Act, even if the transaction or lien was entered**

1 into or created before the operative date specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act.

2 (2) The amendments to statutes by sections 1 to 19 of this 2012 Act do not affect an  
 3 action, case or proceeding commenced before the operative date specified in section 28 of this  
 4 2012 Act.

5 **SECTION 21.** (1) A security interest that is a perfected security interest immediately  
 6 before the operative date specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act is a perfected security in-  
 7 terest under ORS 79.0102, 79.0105, 79.0208, 79.0307, 79.0311, 79.0316, 79.0317, 79.0326, 79.0335,  
 8 79.0406, 79.0408, 79.0503, 79.0507, 79.0515, 79.0516, 79.0518, 79.0521, 79.0607 and 79.0619, as  
 9 amended by sections 1 to 19 of this 2012 Act, if after the operative date specified in section  
 10 28 of this 2012 Act the applicable requirements for attachment and perfection under the  
 11 amendments to statutes by sections 1 to 19 of this 2012 Act are satisfied without further  
 12 action.

13 (2) Except as otherwise provided in section 23 of this 2012 Act, if immediately before the  
 14 operative date specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act a security interest is a perfected se-  
 15 curity interest but the applicable requirements for perfection under the amendments to  
 16 statutes by sections 1 to 19 of this 2012 Act are not satisfied on or before the operative date  
 17 specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act, the security interest remains perfected thereafter  
 18 only if the applicable requirements for perfection under the amendments to statutes by  
 19 sections 1 to 19 of this 2012 Act are satisfied within one year after the operative date speci-  
 20 fied in section 28 of this 2012 Act.

21 **SECTION 22.** A security interest that is an unperfected security interest immediately  
 22 before the operative date specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act becomes a perfected security

24 (1) Without further action on or after the operative date specified in section 28 of this

5 **(B) June 30, 2018.**

6 **(3) The filing of a continuation statement after the operative date specified in section 28**  
 7 **of this 2012 Act does not continue the effectiveness of a financing statement filed before the**  
 8 **operative date specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act. However, upon the timely filing of a**  
 9 **continuation statement after the operative date specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act and**  
 10 **in accordance with the law of the jurisdiction governing perfection as provided in the**  
 11 **amendments to statutes by sections 1 to 19 of this 2012 Act, the effectiveness of a financing**  
 12 **statement filed in the same office in the jurisdiction before the operative date specified in**  
 13 **section 28 of this 2012 Act continues for the period provided by the law of the jurisdiction.**

14 **(4) Subsection (2)(b)(B) of this section applies to a financing statement that, before the**

24 **(5) A financing statement that includes a financing statement filed before the operative**  
 25 **date specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act and a continuation statement filed before the**  
 26 **operative date specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act is effective only to the extent that the**  
 27 **financing statement satisfies the requirements of ORS 79.0503, 79.0515, 79.0516, 79.0518 and**  
 28 **79.0521, as amended by sections 12, 14, 15, 16 and 17 of this 2012 Act, for an initial filing**  
 29 **statement. A financing statement that indicates that the debtor is a decedent's estate indi-**  
 30 **cates that the collateral is being administered by a personal representative within the**  
 31 **meaning of ORS 79.0503 (1)(b), as amended by section 12 of this 2012 Act. A financing**  
 32 **statement that indicates that the debtor is a trust or is a trustee acting with respect to**  
 33 **property held in trust indicates that the collateral is held in a trust within the meaning of**  
 34 **ORS 79.0503 (1)(c), as amended by section 12 of this 2012 Act.**

35 **SECTION 24. (1) The filing of an initial filing statement in the office specified in ORS**  
 36 **79.0501 continues the effectiveness of a financing statement filed before the operative date**  
 37 **specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act if:**

38 **(a) The filing of an initial financing statement in the office would be effective to perfect**  
 39 **a security interest under the amendments to statutes by sections 1 to 19 of this 2012 Act;**

40 **(b) The financing statement filed before the operative date specified in section 28 of this**  
 41 **2012 Act was filed in an office in another state; and**

42 **(c) The initial financing statement satisfies the provisions of subsection (3) of this sec-**  
 43 **tion.**

44 **(2) The filing of an initial financing statement under subsection (1) of this section con-**  
 45 **tinues the effectiveness of the financing statement filed before the operative date specified**

1 in section 28 of this 2012 Act:

2 (a) If the initial financing statement is filed before the operative date specified in section  
 3 28 of this 2012 Act, for the period provided in ORS 79.0515, as that statute existed before the  
 4 operative date specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act, with respect to an initial financing  
 5 statement; and

6 (b) If the initial financing statement is filed after the operative date specified in section  
 7 28 of this 2012 Act, for the period provided in ORS 79.0515, as amended by section 14 of this

26 (2) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (3) of this section, if the law of this state  
 27 governs perfection of a security interest, the information in a financing statement filed be-  
 28 fore the operative date specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act may be amended after the  
 29 operative date specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act only if:

30 (a) The financing statement filed before the operative date specified in section 28 of this  
 31 2012 Act and an amendment are filed in the office specified in ORS 79.0501;

32 (b) An amendment is filed in the office specified in ORS 79.0501 concurrently with or after

37 (3) If the law of this state governs perfection of a security interest, the effectiveness of  
 38 a financing statement filed before the operative date specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act  
 39 may be continued only under section 23 (3) and (5) or 24 of this 2012 Act.

40 (4) Whether or not the law of this state governs perfection of a security interest, the  
 41 effectiveness of a financing statement filed in this state before the operative date specified  
 42 in section 28 of this 2012 Act may be terminated after the operative date specified in section  
 43 28 of this 2012 Act by filing a termination statement in an office in which the financing  
 44 statement filed before the operative date specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act is filed unless  
 45 an initial financing statement that satisfies section 24 (3) of this 2012 Act has been filed in

1 the office specified as the office in which to file a financing statement by the law of the ju-  
2 risdiction governing perfection as provided in the amendments to statutes by sections 1 to

4 **SECTION 26.** A person may file an initial financing statement or a continuation state-  
5 ment under sections 20 to 27 of this 2012 Act if:

6 (1) The secured party of record authorizes the filing; and

7 (2) The filing is necessary under sections 20 to 27 of this 2012 Act:

8 (a) To continue the effectiveness of a financing statement filed before the operative date  
9 specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act; or

10 (b) To perfect or continue the perfection of a security interest.

11 **SECTION 27.** The amendments to ORS 79.0102, 79.0105, 79.0208, 79.0307, 79.0311, 79.0316,  
12 79.0317, 79.0326, 79.0335, 79.0406, 79.0408, 79.0503, 79.0507, 79.0515, 79.0516, 79.0518, 79.0521,  
13 79.0607 and 79.0619 by sections 1 to 19 of this 2012 Act determine the priority of conflicting  
14 claims to collateral. However, if the relative priorities of the claims were established before  
15 the operative date specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act, ORS 79.0102, 79.0105, 79.0208,  
16 79.0307, 79.0311, 79.0316, 79.0317, 79.0326, 79.0335, 79.0406, 79.0408, 79.0503, 79.0507, 79.0515,  
17 79.0516, 79.0518, 79.0521, 79.0607 and 79.0619, as those statutes existed before the operative  
18 date specified in section 28 of this 2012 Act, determine priority.

19 **SECTION 28.** The amendments to ORS 79.0102, 79.0105, 79.0208, 79.0307, 79.0311, 79.0316,  
20 79.0317, 79.0326, 79.0335, 79.0406, 79.0408, 79.0503, 79.0507, 79.0515, 79.0516, 79.0518, 79.0521,  
21 79.0607 and 79.0619 by sections 1 to 19 of this 2012 Act become operative July 1, 2013.

22 **SECTION 29.** The section captions used in this 2012 Act are provided only for the con-  
23 venience of the reader and do not become part of the statutory law of this state or express  
24 any legislative intent in the enactment of this 2012 Act.

25 **SECTION 30.** This 2012 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public  
26 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2012 Act takes effect  
27 on its passage.

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
