SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Requires Department of Education to collect performance report data for each school year regarding number of teachers and number of students assigned to each course offered by public educational providers. Requires department to collect performance report data only if funding is available from federal or state sources.

Takes effect July 1, 2012.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to performance report data; and prescribing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Education shall collect performance report data for each school year that includes the number of teachers and the number of students assigned to each course. The data must be collected from all public kindergarten through grade 12 educational providers that provide instruction, including but not limited to school districts, education service districts, the Oregon School for the Deaf and the Youth Corrections Education Program.

(2) The department shall make the data available to the public educational providers and the public in a format that is easily accessible.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) For the 2012-2013 school year, the Department of Education is required to collect performance report data under section 1 of this 2012 Act only for:

- (a) Courses in reading, language arts or English in grades 3 through 8 and grade 11;
- (b) Courses in writing in grade 11; and
- (c) Courses in mathematics in grades 3 through 8 and grade 11.
- (2) This section becomes operative for the 2011-2013 biennium on the date the Office of the Legislative Counsel receives notification from the Department of Education that the department has received federal funds, or has been appropriated moneys by the Legislative Assembly, in an amount sufficient to pay the costs of collecting the performance report data required under this section.

SECTION 3. Section 1 of this 2012 Act becomes operative for a biennium on the date the Office of the Legislative Counsel receives notification from the Department of Education that the department has received federal funds, or has been appropriated moneys by the Legislative Assembly, in an amount sufficient to pay the costs of collecting the performance report data required under section 1 of this 2012 Act.

SECTION 4. This 2012 Act takes effect on July 1, 2012.

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
