We are also put at a disadvantage economically if we close down and lose 100% of our income while other offices remain open and take advantage of a higher percentage of the total clients looking for a fishing trip.

This may seem like a simple and easy decision to an outside eye but it is one that has kept any socially conscious business owner awake at nights. Those with no care for the publics well being will benefit while those who choose to make the right decision may whither and die. I do not wish to put anyone into a position of going out of business permanently, that is why your working group needs to quickly establish a policy to support businesses that close to help prevent the spread of this highly contagious virus, and to close all non essential businesses to prevent even more drastic measures like a shelter in place declaration.
