I live in the central city area in NW Hills near Pittock and am horrified with the numbers of unhoused people I see living on the street, most with severe mental illness that is untreated. I have learned it's safer to shop in Beaverton for all my groceries and household items than to brave the Fred Meyer or Safeway downtown. It's a dystopian nightmare and not uncommon for me to see someone completely naked walking down W. Burnside screaming and stopping cars in the middle of the street. It is outrageous the amount of money being spent to NOT provide housing to the unhoused--just sweep the encampments so they move to some other street.
