## Dear Co-Chairs:

The Oregon State Marine Board's (OSMB) core mission is serving Oregon's recreational boating public through education, enforcement, access, and environmental stewardship for a safe and enjoyable experience. We value transparency, trust and credibility, innovation, boating and diversity and inclusion.

The agency's approach to reductions was guided by our priority to protect statutorily funded programs. We recognize that reducing funding for our Facilities and Law Enforcement programs—primarily in the form of grants—will have a significant impact. Our legislatively approved budget is \$43.9 million, with 71% allocated to Law Enforcement and Facility programs that support 30 county sheriff's offices and the Oregon State Police. The Boating Facilities Program, which provides grants and technical assistance for the maintenance and improvement of public recreational boating facilities statewide, is also affected. However, because 71% of our funds are committed to just two programs, any necessary reductions must begin there.
