Summary of Revenue Changes

Summary of Subcommittee Action

House Bill 2524 appropriates \$201,467 General Fund to the Department of Administrative Services, Office for Oregon Health Policy and Research to establish the Oregon Health Care Acquired Infection Reporting Program. This allocation funds one permanent Research Analyst 4 position (1.00 full-time equivalent) beginning July 1, 2007 to coordinate the collection and reporting on infectious measures for all Oregon health care facilities.

This bill establishes the 16 member Health Case Acquired Infection Advisory Committee, of which the members are not entitled to compensation. The bill directs the Office for Oregon Health Policy and Research to adopt administrative rules for the program. The bill also gives the Office for Oregon Health Policy and Research the authority to assess civil penalties that are not to exceed \$500 per day of violation, determined by the severity of the violation, for any health care facility that fails to perform as required. The bill also allows the Office to take action related to this bill prior to the operative date and it sunsets or repeals on January 2, 2018.
