Summary of Subcommittee Action

House Bill 3563-A establishes the Public Safety Strategies Task Force consisting of six members, two each appointed by the Senate President, the Speaker of the House, and the Governor. The task force ends on the date of the convening of the next regular biennial legislative session. Its purpose is to:

- examine state-funded programs to ensure they effectively and efficiently reduce and prevent crime, crime rates, and victimization rates;
- identify ways to increase support for successful programs;
- identify ways to prevent people from committing crimes;
- make recommendations consistent with the Oregon Constitution's punishment principles and that are based on cost-benefit analysis; and
- consider the best use of resources to reduce crime and victimization rates and hold offenders accountable, including DNA testing, expanded criminal record checks, and increased use of local jail beds by the Department of Corrections.

The task force is required to report to the interim Judiciary Committee no later than October 1, 2008.

The Legislative Administration Committee (LAC) is directed to provide support, using existing, permanent committee staff. The Subcommittee approved a \$100,000 General Fund appropriation to LAC for expenses such as professional, technical, or consultative services to support the task force.
