Measure Description:

Refers tot the voters an Increase of cigarette tax by 84.5 cents per pack, and other tobacco products tax by 30% of wholesale price. Distributes the tax revenues to the Oregon Health Kids Program Fund, Oregon Health plans, Tobacco Use Reduction Account, General Fund, and Local Government. Imposes a floor tax as the new tax on the first day of the calendar month following the implementation date. If approved by the voters, cigarette and tobacco tax increases become effective Jan 1, 2008.

Impact Explanation:

The hold harmless distribution takes 6.5% of the new cigarette money and distributes it using the 58-cent formula. Then 13% will distributed according to the adjusted 60-cent formula. The (80.5%) amounts are distributed Then the remaining go to Healthy Kids Fund at 94.827%, and 5.173% to Tobacco Reduction (TURA) in 2007-09. That distribution changes after June-2009 to 90% to healthy kids programs, and 10% to the (TURA). Out of the Healthy Kids Fund, two other distributions occur at 1.52% to Rural Health care, and 3.97% to Kids Safety Net.

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
