WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Expands exemption from Oregon car title, car registration, driver license and driver permit requirements to include those that have been a resident of Oregon for less than 30 days. Changes reference regarding driving privileges for non-residents from privileges granted by the “home jurisdiction of the person” to “out-of-state license or driver permit.”

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Effect on registrations or drivers licenses that are still current in another state

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Currently, ORS 807.062(2), states that a resident of Oregon may not operate a motor vehicle in this state unless the person receives a driver license or permit from the Oregon Department of Transportation. Similarly, a person commits the offense of failure to register a vehicle if the person owns a vehicle in this state and does not register it with the Oregon Department of Transportation (ORS 803.300).

HB 2034 exempts persons who have been a resident of Oregon for less than 30 days from these requirements.
