WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Divides content of existing construction contractor statute into smaller statutes. Adjusts statutory references to existing statute. Makes regulatory subdivisions for other political subdivisions the same as limitations for cities and counties.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Construction Contractor Board's ability to pull license when contractor loses license with other agency.
- Current statute and the need to reorder statute so that it may be easier to read.

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Adopted amendments rewrite ORS 701.100 to ensure that contractors who lose their license with other agencies, or are out of compliance with Oregon tax, unemployment workers compensation, independent contractor, or other laws, may have their CCB license suspended or revoked.

BACKGROUND: House Bill 2109 is a housekeeping bill designed to clarify current language in the Construction Contractors Licensing Act in ORS 701.055. ORS 701.055 contains laws on a variety of subjects, many of which are unrelated. This bill reorganizes 701.055 into several statutes, each dealing with one subject, without changing policy with the exception of clarifying that cities, counties and political subdivisions should be treated in the same manner throughout the statute. The measure amends existing statue concerning application for construction permits, related notice requirements of construction contractors and disciplinary actions.
