**EFFECTIVE DATE:** On passage.

**GOVERNOR'S BUDGET:** This bill is anticipated by the Governor's recommended budget.

**LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE:** This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

**COMMENTS:** This measure repeals the sunset date, currently January 1, 2008, and makes permanent the Sexual Assault Victims' Medical Response Fund. This fund is used to encourage appropriate and confidential medical care for victims of sexual assault. The primary uses of the fund are for medical assessments and forensic evidence collection.
