WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Modifies membership of State Apprenticeship and Training Council and establishes minimum qualifications.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Provisions of measure.

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: Changes minimum qualifications for membership on Council. Limits local joint committees in building and construction trades to group programs serving multiple employers.

BACKGROUND: The State Apprenticeship and Training Council is comprised of ten members appointed by the Governor as follows: four members from the crafts or trades, four members from industrial occupations, and two members representing the public. HB 2261 A will reduce the membership to eight by replacing the four members from the industrial occupations with two members from "other apprenticeable occupations." The four members from the crafts or trades must come from the building or construction industry.

HB 2261 A provides that the minimum qualifications for membership are active participation on an apprenticeship governing body for a minimum of four years or a minimum of four years of experience in workforce development or investment activities, vocational training or education, apprenticeship program administration or a related discipline.
