WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Clarifies that a municipal or justice court may assign a criminal judgment to a private collection agency and may add a reasonable collection fee to the judgment.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Reasonableness of collection fee
- Collection agencies and the municipal or justice courts that enter into contracts for the collection of past due fines, fees, and assessments
- Contracts that set the fee the collection agency may retain

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: ORS 137.118 allows a municipal or justice court to add to any judgment in a criminal action that includes a monetary obligation a fee for the cost of collection if the court gives the defendant a period of time to pay the obligation. The collection fee cannot exceed 25 percent of the obligation owed and may not be more than \$250.
