**WHAT THE MEASURE DOES:** Requires person to complete education requirements within one year prior to submitting an application for issuance of vehicle dealer certificate.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- Measure fixes an oversight when ORS 822.027 was enacted by the 1999 Legislature
- Number of educational hours needed to receive and maintain a vehicle dealer certificate

**EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** Changes the timeframe for completing education requirements from three years to one year.

**BACKGROUND:** HB 2437-A amends ORS 822.027, regarding education requirements for vehicle dealers, to establish a timeline for completing the required educational requirements prior to submitting an application for a vehicle dealer certificate. Current statute does not establish a timeframe.

Becoming a vehicle dealer in Oregon requires completing eight hours of education through an approved provider. The dealer certificate is valid for three years; the certificate holder must also complete five hours of continuing education per year and hold a three-year surety bond of \$40,000.
