WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Allows the governing body of an Oregon city with a population greater than 400,000 is the budget committee of the city's urban renewal agency.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Intent on how the City of Portland would carry out the measure's provisions in reviewing the Portland Development Commission's budget
- 2005 legislation which authorized the City of Portland to establish a budget committee
- Discussions regarding how to best align the functions of the Portland City Council and the Portland Development Commission

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: Under ORS 294.341, cities whose population is over 200,000 are required to have the governing body (i.e. the city council) act as the budget committee unless a formal budget committee is established with an equal membership of elected officials and public members.

HB 3104 adds a new provision which clarifies that only the governing body for a city with a population greater than 400,000 can be the budget committee of the city's urban renewal agency.
