WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Exempts tankless water heaters from boiler and pressure vessel laws.

## **ISSUES DISCUSSED:**

- How a tankless water heater works
- Support from the Department of Consumer and Business Services' Building Codes Division
- Level of water pressure

## **EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT:** No amendment.

**BACKGROUND:** A tankless water heater heats water "on demand" as it is needed, eliminating the need for a storage tank. They are not currently considered exempt vessels from current statute because they surpass the 200,000 BTU per hour heat input standard, although they do not store any water.

HB 3360 allows licensed plumbing contractors to install, alter and repair tankless water heaters by exempting the devices from current boiler and pressure vessel laws.
