WHAT THE MEASURE DOES: Allows the court to direct the Department of Human Services (DHS) to place a child with parents, relatives or another foster care provider.

ISSUES DISCUSSED:

- Studies show that children do better when placed with relatives
- Oregon is only one of two states that does not give basic support to relative foster care parents

EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: A court may take jurisdiction of a person under the age of 18 years if the child's welfare is being endangered, or the child has been neglected, abandoned or subjected to abuse. If the child is removed from the home, the court usually awards custody to the Children, Adults and Families Division of the DHS.

Studies show that children who are placed with relatives, or persons with whom they have a close relationship, adjust better than children placed with strangers.
