EFFECT OF COMMITTEE AMENDMENT: No amendment.

BACKGROUND: The Portland Rose Festival was first held in June 1907, produced by the Portland Rose Festival Association. The Portland Rose Festival Grand Floral Parade, the largest single-day spectator event in Oregon with an estimated 500,000 spectators, is the second largest floral parade in the United States.

For 2007, the Starlight Parade will be Saturday, June 2 at 8:30 p.m.; the Junior Parade is Wednesday June 6 at 1:00 p.m.; the Grand Floral Parade is Saturday, June 9 at 10:00 a.m.; the Waterfront Village along the Willamette River opens May 31; and the fleet of naval vessels ties up beside Tom McCall Waterfront Park's esplanade seawall beginning Monday June 4.
