EFFECTIVE DATE: January 1, 2008

GOVERNOR'S BUDGET: This bill is not anticipated by the Governor's recommended budget.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE: This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

COMMENTS: This measure states that an employer may not enter into a contract for public works exceeding \$350,000 unless the employer is an approved apprenticeship training agent. The measure also requires that 15 percent of total hours worked on a public works project be performed by apprentices.

This fiscal impact statement is for the purpose of transmitting the measure from the House Committee on Business and Labor to the House Committee on Workforce and Economic Development. A detailed fiscal impact statement will be issued for the measure when it is considered by the House Committee on Workforce and Economic Development.
