EFFECTIVE DATE: January 1, 2008

GOVERNOR'S BUDGET: This bill is not anticipated by the Governor's recommended budget.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE: This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

COMMENTS: This bill exempts from disclosure, upon request of the individual, personal information such as name, home address and telephone number that may be contained in voter registration records or real property assessment or taxation records. Individuals covered by this bill include, district attorneys, deputy district attorneys, assistant attorney generals and public safety officers.

The fiscal impact of this bill is indeterminate. The Department of Justice reports this bill will not have a fiscal impact on the Department. However, counties report a fiscal impact from \$0 to \$150,000. This fiscal impact may depend on the age of the system, the extent of the programming changes that need to be made, the population of the county and the availability of internal resources. Legislative Fiscal Office received responses from 11 counties indicating a fiscal impact. It is safe to assume that the other 25 counties would have similar fiscal impacts. An accurate estimate of the fiscal impact is not possible without more extensive conversations with county clerks and tax assessors.
