GOVERNOR'S BUDGET: This bill is not anticipated by the Governor's recommended budget.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT MANDATE: This bill does not affect local governments' service levels or shared revenues sufficient to trigger Section 15, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

COMMENTS: This bill changes the membership of the Board of Public Safety Standards and Training (BPSST), changes the membership of the BPSST policy committees, creates a Certification Review Committee, and requires BPSST to establish "fitness for duty" standards.

This bill establishes a seven member Certification Review Committee (CRC) that will be responsible for determinations of denial, revocation, or suspension, of certifications based on the failure to meet established standards. In addition, the CRCS will be responsible for establishing "fitness for duty" standards through the administrative rule process and allow individuals whose certifications have been revoked or denied to reapply at a later date under specified circumstances. The establishment of the CRC will require 2 positions (1.25 FTE) in 2007-09 to support the duties of the subcommittee and to establish "fitness for duty" standards through the administrative rule process. The ongoing support of the CRC can be managed with 1 position (1.0 FTE). Currently, the staff of the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training (DPSST) processes all mandatory disqualifications. This bill will require all mandatory and discretionary disqualifications to be reviewed by the CRC and provides for a contested case hearing if necessary. Review of all disqualifications by the CRC will result in increased workload for DPSST staff to prepare all disqualification cases for review by the CRC.

DPSST is funded with revenues from the Criminal Fines and Assessments Account (CFAA). Any funds left in the CFAA are returned to the General Fund. Because this bill may require additional positions and

expenditures the Legislative Fiscal Office believes it warrants a subsequent referral to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means for consideration of the bill's impact on the General Fund.
