SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Requires operators and passengers of Class I and Class III all-terrain vehicles to wear motorcycle helmets with fastened chin straps. **Provides exemptions.**
