SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Prohibits operators of Class I and Class III all-terrain vehicles from carrying passengers on vehicles not designed for passengers. Punishes by maximum of \$180 fine.

- 2 Relating to passenger safety on all-terrain vehicles.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2007 Act is added to and made a part of the Oregon Vehicle 5 Code.
 - <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) Except as provided in subsections (2) and (3) of this section, a person commits the offense of operating a Class II or Class III all-terrain vehicle while carrying a passenger if the person:
 - (a) Operates a Class I or Class III all-terrain vehicle on premises open to the public while carrying a passenger.
 - (b) Is a parent, legal guardian or person with legal responsibility for the safety and welfare of a child under 18 years of age, and the child operates a Class I or Class III all-terrain vehicle on premises open to the public while carrying a passenger.
 - (2) A person does not violate this section if:
 - (a) The person operates a Class I or Class III all-terrain vehicle that is designed to carry passengers; and
 - (b) The person does not carry more passengers than the manufacturer recommends.
 - (3) The passenger restriction does not apply if the all-terrain vehicle is:
 - (a) Used exclusively in farming, agricultural or forestry operations or used by persons licensed under ORS chapter 571 exclusively for nursery or Christmas tree growing operations; or
 - (b) Used on land owned or leased by the owner of the vehicle.
 - (4) The offense described in this section, operating a Class I or Class III all-terrain vehicle while carrying a passenger, is a Class C traffic violation.
