## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Creates crime of obstructing an audit. Punishes by maximum of five years' imprisonment, \$125,000 fine, or both.

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT
2	Relating to audits.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. A person commits the crime of obstructing an audit if the person:
5	(1) Is an employee of a state agency as defined in ORS 297.110; and
6	(2) During an audit conducted pursuant to ORS 297.210 or an investigation conducted
7	pursuant to ORS 177.180 or 297.120:
8	(a) Intentionally makes a false material statement or provides false or misleading mate-
9	rial information to the Secretary of State or a person conducting an audit or investigation
10	on behalf of the Secretary of State;
11	(b) Intentionally withholds material information; or
12	(c) Directs another person not to cooperate with the audit or investigation, or otherwise
13	prevents or attempts to prevent another person from cooperating.
14	SECTION 2. Violation of section 1 of this 2007 Act is a Class C felony.
