

SENATE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2285

2 insert “amending ORS 238A.025, 238A.130, 238A.140, 238A.142, 238A.165, 238A.305 and 243.800 and
3 section 46b, chapter 733, Oregon Laws 2003; and repealing ORS 238.180 and 238A.157 and section
4 2a, chapter 733, Oregon Laws 2003.”.

“BREAK IN SERVICE

9 “**SECTION 1.** ORS 238A.025 is amended to read:

10 “238A.025. (1) The Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan is established. The purpose of the
11 Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan is to provide career public employees with a secure and fair
12 retirement income at an affordable, stable and predictable cost to the taxpayers. The Oregon Public
13 Service Retirement Plan is composed of a pension program and an individual account program. The
14 pension program and the individual account program are separate accounts for purposes of federal
15 income tax qualification, and the assets of each program must be held as part of the trust estab-
16 lished by ORS 238.660 for the exclusive benefit of the participants and beneficiaries. It is the intent
17 of the Legislative Assembly that pursuant to section 414(k) of the Internal Revenue Code the indi-
18 vidual account program be established and maintained as a tax-qualified defined contribution gov-
19 ernmental plan for the purposes of sections 72(d) and 415 of the Internal Revenue Code. The Public
20 Employees Retirement Board may create separate accounts within the Public Employees Retirement
21 Fund for the pension program and the individual account program.

22 “(2) Notwithstanding any provision of ORS chapter 238, any person who is employed by a par-
23 ticipating public employer on or after August 29, 2003, and who has not established membership in
24 the Public Employees Retirement System before August 29, 2003, is entitled to receive only the
25 benefits provided under the Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan for periods of service with par-
26 ticipating public employers on and after August 29, 2003, and has no right or claim to any benefit
27 under ORS chapter 238 except as specifically provided by this chapter.

28 “(3)[(a)] Any person who is [*an active*] a member of the Public Employees Retirement System on
29 August 28, 2003, is entitled to receive the benefits provided by ORS chapter 238 for all service
30 performed before, on and after August 29, 2003, **unless the person’s membership in the system**
31 **is subsequently terminated under ORS 238.095**[, *unless the person has a break in service on or*
32 *after August 29, 2003*]. If the [*person has a break in service*] **person’s membership in the system**
33 **is terminated under ORS 238.095** on or after August 29, 2003, the person is entitled to receive [*the*
34 *benefits provided by ORS chapter 238 for all creditable service performed before the break in service,*
35 *and*] the benefits provided under the Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan for periods of service

1 with participating public employers after the [break in service] **termination of membership.**

2 “[(b) Except as provided in this subsection, a person has a break in service for the purposes of this
3 subsection if the person performs no service with a participating public employer in a qualifying posi-
4 tion for a period of six consecutive months.]

5 “[(c) If a person leaves employment with a participating public employer for purposes that would
6 qualify the person for family leave under ORS 659A.150 to 659A.186, the person has a break in service
7 for the purposes of this subsection only if the person performs no service with a participating public
8 employer in a qualifying position for a period of 12 consecutive months after leaving employment with
9 the participating public employer.]

10 “[(d) If a person leaves employment with a participating public employer for career development
11 purposes pursuant to written authorization of the participating public employer under a written policy
12 of the employer that applies generally to the class of employees to which the member belongs, the person
13 has a break in service for the purposes of this subsection only if the person performs no service with
14 a participating public employer in a qualifying position for a period of 12 consecutive months after
15 leaving employment with the participating public employer.]

16 “[(e) A person does not have a break in service for the purposes of this subsection by reason of
17 any period of time during which the person leaves employment with a participating public employer for
18 the purpose of serving as a member of the Legislative Assembly during a legislative session.]

19 “[(f) A person does not have a break in service for the purposes of this subsection by reason of any
20 period of time during which the person is absent from employment with a participating public employer
21 and receives a disability retirement allowance under ORS 238.320.]

22 “[(g) A person does not have a break in service for the purposes of this subsection by reason of
23 any period of time during which the person leaves employment with a participating public employer
24 based on the seasonal nature of the person’s employment as long as the person returns to employment
25 with the public employer before the expiration of 12 full calendar months.]

26 “(4) A person establishes membership in the system before August 29, 2003, for the purposes of
27 this section if:

28 “(a) The person is a member of the system, or a judge member of the system, on August 28, 2003;
29 or

30 “(b) The person performed any period of service for a participating public employer before Au-
31 gust 29, 2003, that is credited to the six-month period of employment required of an employee under
32 ORS 238.015 before an employee may become a member of the system.

33 “(5) Except as provided in this chapter, ORS chapter 238 does not apply to the Oregon Public
34 Service Retirement Plan.

35 “(6) The provisions of this section do not apply to a person elected or appointed as a judge as
36 defined in ORS 238.500.

37 “**SECTION 2.** ORS 238A.165 is amended to read:

38 “238A.165. (1) Except as provided in this section, earliest retirement age for a member of the
39 pension program is 55 years of age.

40 “(2) Earliest retirement age for a member of the pension program who retires from service as
41 a police officer or firefighter is 50 years of age if the member has held a position as a police officer
42 or firefighter continuously for a period of not less than five years immediately before the effective
43 date of retirement. Earliest retirement date for a member described in this subsection is not later
44 than the date the member reaches 55 years of age.

45 “[(3) If a member has a break in service under ORS 238A.025 and is entitled to receive a retire-

1 *ment allowance under ORS chapter 238 in addition to a pension under this chapter, earliest retirement*
2 *age under this chapter is the age attained by a member when the member could first make application*
3 *for retirement under the provisions of ORS 238.280.]*

4 “[(4)] (3) A member of the pension program who has reached earliest retirement age may retire
5 on an early retirement date that is the first day of any month on or after the member has reached
6 earliest retirement age.

7 “**SECTION 3.** ORS 238A.305 is amended to read:

8 “238A.305. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, all members of the Public
9 Employees Retirement System who established membership in the Public Employees Retirement
10 System before August 29, 2003, as described in ORS 238A.025 become members of the individual
11 account program on January 1, 2004.

12 “(2) A member of the Public Employees Retirement System may not be a member of the indi-
13 vidual account program during any period of time during which the member is required to make
14 contributions to the system under ORS 238.200.

15 “(3) Solely for the purpose of determining the amount of the employee contribution for persons
16 who become members of the individual account program under this section, whether paid by the
17 employee or by the employer, the Public Employees Retirement Board shall use the definition of
18 ‘salary’ provided by ORS 238.005. *[If a person who is subject to this subsection has a break in service*
19 *as described in ORS 238A.025, the board shall use the definition of ‘salary’ provided by ORS 238A.005*
20 *for the purpose of determining the amount of the employee contribution to the individual account pro-*
21 *gram for all service by the member after the break in service.]*

22 “**SECTION 4.** Section 46b, chapter 733, Oregon Laws 2003, is amended to read:

23 “**Sec. 46b.** (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, *[section 46a of this 2003 Act]*
24 **ORS 237.650** applies to all members of the Legislative Assembly who take office on or after *[the ef-*
25 *fective date of this 2003 Act]* **August 29, 2003.**

26 “(2) In addition to the options provided by *[section 46a of this 2003 Act]* **ORS 237.650**, any person
27 who is a member of the Legislative Assembly on *[the effective date of this 2003 Act]* **August 29, 2003**,
28 and who is a member of the Public Employees Retirement System on *[the effective date of this 2003*
29 *Act]* **August 29, 2003**, may elect to remain a member of the system under ORS chapter 238 for so
30 long as the member remains in continuous service as a member of the Legislative Assembly. An
31 election under this subsection must be made in the manner provided by *[section 46a (2) of this 2003*
32 *Act]* **ORS 237.650 (2).**

33 “(3) A member of the Legislative Assembly remains in continuous service as a member of the
34 Legislative Assembly for the purposes of subsection (2) of this section *[for so long as the member*
35 *continues in office without a break in service as described in sections 2 and 2a of this 2003 Act]* **until**
36 **the person resigns or otherwise leaves office.**

37 “**SECTION 5.** ORS 243.800 is amended to read:

38 “243.800. (1) Notwithstanding any provision of ORS chapter 238 or 238A or ORS 243.910 to
39 243.945, the State Board of Higher Education shall establish and administer an Optional Retirement
40 Plan for administrative and academic employees of the Oregon University System who are eligible
41 for membership in the Public Employees Retirement System. The Optional Retirement Plan must be
42 a qualified plan under the Internal Revenue Code, capable of accepting funds transferred under
43 subsection (7) of this section without the transfer being treated as a taxable event under the Inter-
44 nal Revenue Code, and willing to accept those funds. Retirement and death benefits shall be pro-
45 vided under the plan by the purchase of annuity contracts, fixed or variable or a combination

1 thereof, or by contracts for investments in mutual funds.

2 “(2) The State Board of Higher Education shall select at least two life insurance companies
3 providing fixed and variable annuities and at least two investment companies providing mutual
4 funds, but not more than five companies in total, for the purpose of providing benefits under the
5 Optional Retirement Plan. The State Board of Higher Education shall establish selection criteria for
6 the purpose of this subsection.

7 “(3) An administrative or academic employee may make an irrevocable election to participate
8 in the Optional Retirement Plan within six months after being employed. An election under this
9 subsection is effective on the first day of the month following six full months of employment.

10 “(4) An administrative or academic employee who does not elect to participate in the Optional
11 Retirement Plan:

12 “(a) Remains or becomes a member of the Public Employees Retirement System in accordance
13 with ORS chapters 238 and 238A; or

14 “(b) Continues to be assisted by the State Board of Higher Education under ORS 243.920 if the
15 employee is being so assisted.

16 “(5) Except as provided in subsection (6) of this section, employees who elect to participate in
17 the Optional Retirement Plan are ineligible for active membership in the Public Employees Retirement
18 System or for any assistance by the State Board of Higher Education under ORS 243.920 as
19 long as those employees are employed in the Oregon University System and the plan is in effect.

20 “(6)(a) An administrative or academic employee who elects to participate in the Optional Retirement
21 Plan, who has creditable service under ORS chapter 238 as defined by ORS 238.005 and
22 who is not vested shall be considered by the Public Employees Retirement Board to be a terminated
23 member under the provisions of ORS 238.095 as of the effective date of the election, and the amount
24 credited to the member account of the member shall be transferred directly to the Optional Retirement
25 Plan by the Public Employees Retirement Board in the manner provided by subsection (7) of
26 this section.

27 “(b) An administrative or academic employee who elects to participate in the Optional Retirement
28 Plan, who has creditable service under ORS chapter 238 as defined by ORS 238.005 and who
29 is vested shall be considered to be an inactive member by the Public Employees Retirement Board
30 and shall retain all the rights, privileges and options under ORS chapter 238 unless the employee
31 makes a written request to the Public Employees Retirement Board for a transfer of the amounts
32 credited to the member account of the member to the Optional Retirement Plan. A request for a
33 transfer must be made at the time the member elects to participate in the Optional Retirement Plan.
34 Upon receiving the request, the Public Employees Retirement Board shall transfer all amounts
35 credited to the member account of the member directly to the Optional Retirement Plan, and shall
36 terminate all rights, privileges and options of the employee under ORS chapter 238.

37 “(c) An administrative or academic employee who elects to participate in the Optional Retirement
38 Plan, and who is not a vested member of the pension program of the Oregon Public Service
39 Retirement Plan as described in ORS 238A.115 on the date that the election becomes effective, shall
40 be considered to be a terminated member of the pension program by the Public Employees Retirement
41 Board as of the effective date of the election.

42 “(d) An administrative or academic employee who elects to participate in the Optional Retirement
43 Plan, and who is a vested member of the pension program of the Oregon Public Service Retirement
44 Plan as described in ORS 238A.115 on the date that the election becomes effective, shall
45 be considered an inactive member of the pension program by the Public Employees Retirement

1 Board as of the effective date of the election. An employee who is subject to the provisions of this
2 paragraph retains all the rights, privileges and options of an inactive member of the pension pro-
3 gram. If the actuarial equivalent of the employee's benefit under the pension program at the time
4 that the election becomes effective is \$5,000 or less, the employee may make a written request to
5 the Public Employees Retirement Board for a transfer of the employee's interest under the pension
6 program to the Optional Retirement Plan. The request must be made at the time the member elects
7 to participate in the Optional Retirement Plan. Upon receiving the request, the Public Employees
8 Retirement Board shall transfer the amount determined to be the actuarial equivalent of the em-
9 ployee's benefit under the pension program directly to the Optional Retirement Plan, and shall ter-
10 minate the membership of the employee in the pension program.

11 "(e) An administrative or academic employee who elects to participate in the Optional Retire-
12 ment Plan, and who is a vested member of the individual account program of the Oregon Public
13 Service Retirement Plan as described in ORS 238A.320 on the date that the election becomes effec-
14 tive, shall be considered an inactive member of the individual account program by the Public Em-
15 ployees Retirement Board as of the effective date of the election. An employee who is subject to the
16 provisions of this paragraph retains all the rights, privileges and options of an inactive member of
17 the individual account program. An administrative or academic employee who elects to participate
18 in the Optional Retirement Plan, and who is a member of the individual account program of the
19 Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan, may make a written request to the Public Employees Re-
20 tirement Board that all amounts in the member's employee account, rollover account and employer
21 account, to the extent the member is vested in those accounts under ORS 238A.320, be transferred
22 to the Optional Retirement Plan. The request must be made at the time the member elects to par-
23 ticipate in the Optional Retirement Plan. Upon receiving the request, the Public Employees Retire-
24 ment Board shall transfer the amounts directly to the Optional Retirement Plan, and shall terminate
25 the membership of the employee in the individual account program upon making the transfer.

26 "(f) Notwithstanding paragraphs (b), (d) and (e) of this subsection, the Public Employees Retire-
27 ment Board shall not treat any employee as an inactive member under the provisions of this sub-
28 section for the purpose of receiving any benefit under ORS chapter 238 or 238A that requires that
29 the employee be separated from all service with participating public employers and with employers
30 who are treated as part of a participating public employer's controlled group under the federal laws
31 and rules governing the status of the system and the Public Employees Retirement Fund as a qual-
32 ified governmental retirement plan and trust.

33 "(7) Any amounts transferred from the Public Employees Retirement Fund under subsection (6)
34 of this section shall be transferred directly to the Optional Retirement Plan by the Public Employees
35 Retirement Board and shall not be made available to the employee.

36 "(8) An employee participating in the Optional Retirement Plan shall contribute monthly an
37 amount equal to the percentage of the employee's salary that the employee would otherwise have
38 contributed as an employee contribution to the Public Employees Retirement System if the employee
39 had not elected to participate in the Optional Retirement Plan.

40 "(9) The State Board of Higher Education shall contribute monthly to the Optional Retirement
41 Plan the percentage of salary of each employee participating in the plan equal to the percentage
42 of salary that would otherwise have been contributed as an employer contribution on behalf of the
43 employee to the Public Employees Retirement System, before any offset under ORS [238.225 (9)]
44 **238.229 (2)**, if the employee had not elected to participate in the Optional Retirement Plan.

45 "(10) Both employee and employer contributions to an Optional Retirement Plan shall be remit-

1 ted directly to the companies that have issued annuity contracts to the participating employees or
2 directly to the mutual funds.

3 “(11) Benefits under the Optional Retirement Plan are payable to employees who elect to par-
4 ticipate in the plan and their beneficiaries by the selected annuity provider or mutual fund in ac-
5 cordance with the terms of the annuity contracts or the terms of the contract with the mutual fund.
6 Employees electing to participate in the plan agree that benefits payable under the plan are not
7 obligations of the State of Oregon or of the Public Employees Retirement System.

8 “[12] *The percentage of salary contributed by the State Board of Higher Education under sub-*
9 *section (9) of this section on behalf of an employee is not affected by reason of the employee having a*
10 *break in service, as described by ORS 238A.025.]*

11 “**SECTION 6. (1) The amendments to ORS 238A.025, 238A.165, 238A.305 and 243.800 and**
12 **section 46b, chapter 733, Oregon Laws 2003, by sections 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 of this 2007 Act, and**
13 **the repeal of ORS 238.180 and 238A.157 and section 2a, chapter 733, Oregon Laws 2003, by**
14 **section 7 of this 2007 Act, apply to all service by members of the Public Employees Retire-**
15 **ment System, whether performed before, on or after August 29, 2003.**

16 “(2) As soon as possible after the effective date of this 2007 Act, the Public Employees
17 Retirement Board shall recalculate the benefits of any person who retired before the effec-
18 tive date of this 2007 Act if the benefits of the person were affected by the application of ORS
19 238A.025, as in effect immediately before the effective date of this 2007 Act.

20 “(3) As soon as possible after the effective date of this 2007 Act, the Public Employees
21 Retirement Board shall adjust the service credit of any active or inactive member who was
22 affected by the application of ORS 238A.025, as in effect immediately before the effective date
23 of this 2007 Act.

24 “(4) As soon as possible after the effective date of this 2007 Act, the Public Employees
25 Retirement Board shall adjust contributions and account balances of the individual accounts
26 described in ORS 238A.350 for any active or inactive member who was affected by the appli-
27 cation of ORS 238A.025, as in effect immediately before the effective date of this 2007 Act.
28 The board may refund contributions, or require additional contributions, for adjustments to
29 account balances made under this subsection.

30 “**SECTION 7. ORS 238.180 and 238A.157 and section 2a, chapter 733, Oregon Laws 2003,**
31 **as amended by section 8, chapter 332, Oregon Laws 2005, are repealed.**

33 “**ACCRUAL OF CREDIT UNDER**
34 **OREGON PUBLIC SERVICE**
35 **RETIREMENT PLAN**
36

37 “**SECTION 8.** ORS 238A.140 is amended to read:

38 “238A.140. [(1) *A pension program member shall accrue no retirement credit for any calendar year*
39 *in which the member has fewer than 600 hours of service. A member may not accrue more than one*
40 *full year of retirement credit in any calendar year.]*

41 “(1) **An active member of the pension program accrues one year of retirement credit for**
42 **each complete year of service and one-twelfth of a year of retirement credit for each full**
43 **month and each major fraction of a month of service.**

44 “(2) **An active member who is a school employee shall be credited with at least six**
45 **months of retirement credit if the member performs service for a major fraction of each**

1 **month of a school year that falls between January 1 and June 30, and at least six months**
2 **of retirement credit if the member performs service for a major fraction of each month of**
3 **a school year that falls between July 1 and December 31.**

4 “[2)] (3) When an eligible employee becomes a member under ORS 238A.100, the board shall
5 credit the eligible employee with retirement credit for the period of employment required of the
6 employee under ORS 238A.100.

7 “(4) **A member may not accrue more than one full year of retirement credit in any cal-**
8 **endar year.**

9 “[3) *Except as provided in this section, a pension program member shall accrue one full year of*
10 *retirement credit for each calendar year in which the member has 2,000 hours of service or more.]*

11 “[4) *Except as provided in this section, a pension program member shall accrue a prorated year*
12 *of retirement credit for each calendar year in which the member has 600 hours of service or more but*
13 *fewer than 2,000 hours of service. The prorated retirement credit shall be calculated by dividing the*
14 *number of hours of service by 2,000.]*

15 “[5) *If an active member of the pension program works as a school employee for one or more*
16 *participating public employers during a calendar year, and the number of hours of service required for*
17 *a full-time school employee employed by the participating public employer or employers is less than*
18 *2,000, the member accrues retirement credit for the calendar year as follows:]*

19 “[a) *The member accrues one full year of retirement credit for the calendar year if the member’s*
20 *hours of service as a school employee are equal to or greater than the number of hours of service re-*
21 *quired of a full-time school employee employed in the same position or a comparable position by the*
22 *participating public employer or employers during the calendar year.]*

23 “[b) *The member accrues a prorated year of retirement credit for each calendar year in which the*
24 *member has at least 600 hours of service but less than the number of hours of service required of a*
25 *full-time school employee employed in the same position or a comparable position by the participating*
26 *public employer or employers during the calendar year. The prorated retirement credit shall be calcu-*
27 *lated by dividing the number of the member’s hours of service as a school employee by the number of*
28 *hours of service required of a full-time school employee in the same position or a comparable*
29 *position.]*

30 “[c) *The Public Employees Retirement Board shall adopt rules governing the accrual of retirement*
31 *credit on a prorated basis by an active member who works in both a school employee position and*
32 *another qualifying position during the same calendar year, or who works as a school employee for more*
33 *than one participating public employer during the same calendar year.]*

34 “[6) *An active member of the pension program who works as an academic employee of a commu-*
35 *nity college during a calendar year:]*

36 “[a) *Accrues one full year of retirement credit for the calendar year if the member is employed 1.0*
37 *full-time equivalent on a nine-month or 12-month basis.]*

38 “[b) *Accrues a prorated year of retirement credit for each calendar year in which the member*
39 *performs the services of less than 1.0 full-time equivalent. The member is entitled to prorated retirement*
40 *credit under this paragraph in an amount determined by dividing by 1,200 the number of hours cal-*
41 *culated to be the equivalent of the percentage in excess of 0.375 full-time equivalent for a member em-*
42 *ployed on a 12-month basis, or in excess of 0.50 full-time equivalent for a member employed on a*
43 *nine-month basis.]*

44 “[7)] (5) For purposes of this section, ‘school employee’ means:

45 “(a) A person who is employed by a common school district, a union high school district or an

1 education service district;

2 “(b) An employee of the State Board of Higher Education or the Oregon Health and Science
3 University who is engaged in teaching or other school activity at an institution of higher education;

4 “(c) An employee of the Department of Human Services, the Oregon Youth Authority, the De-
5 partment of Corrections or the State Board of Education who is engaged in teaching or other school
6 activity at an institution supervised by the authority, board or department; and

7 “(d) An employee of a community college district other than an academic employee.

8 “**SECTION 9.** ORS 238A.130 is amended to read:

9 “238A.130. (1) Except as provided in subsection (3) of this section, for purposes of the computa-
10 tion of pension program benefits under ORS 238A.125, ‘final average salary’ means whichever of the
11 following is greater:

12 “(a) The average salary per calendar year paid to an active member in the three consecutive
13 calendar years of membership that produce the highest average salary, including calendar years in
14 which the member was employed for less than a full calendar year. If the number of consecutive
15 calendar years of active membership before the effective date of retirement of the member is three
16 or less, the final average salary for the member is the average salary per calendar year paid to the
17 member in all of those years, without regard to whether the member was employed for full calendar
18 years.

19 “(b) One-third of the total salary paid to an active member in the last 36 calendar months of
20 membership before the effective date of retirement of the member.

21 “(2) For the purposes of calculating the final average salary of a member under subsection (1)
22 of this section, the Public Employees Retirement Board shall:

23 “(a) Include any salary paid in or for the calendar month of separation from employment;

24 “(b) Exclude any salary for any pay period before the first full pay period that is included in the
25 three consecutive calendar years of membership under subsection (1)(a) of this section; and

26 “(c) Exclude any salary for any pay period before the first full pay period that is included in the
27 last 36 calendar months of membership under subsection (1)(b) of this section.

28 “(3) For purposes of the computation of pension program benefits under ORS 238A.125 of a
29 person employed by a local government as defined in ORS 174.116, ‘final average salary’ means
30 whichever of the following is greater:

31 “(a) The average salary per calendar year earned by an active member in the three consecutive
32 calendar years of membership that produce the highest average salary, including calendar years in
33 which the member was employed for less than a full calendar year. If the number of consecutive
34 calendar years of active membership before the effective date of retirement of the member is three
35 or less, the final average salary for the member is the average salary per calendar year earned by
36 the member in all of those years, without regard to whether the member was employed for full cal-
37 endar years.

38 “(b) One-third of the total salary earned by an active member in the last 36 calendar months
39 of membership before the effective date of retirement of the member.

40 “[4] *For purposes of calculating the final average salary for a member during any period in which*
41 *the member worked in a qualifying position that requires fewer than 2,000 hours of service in a cal-*
42 *endar year, the salary of the member for that period is the salary that would have been paid if the*
43 *member had worked in the same position on a full-time basis.]*

44 “[5] (4) For the purposes of calculating the final average salary of a member under this section,
45 the salary of the member does not include any amounts attributable to hours of overtime that exceed

1 the average number of hours of overtime for the same class of employees as established by rule of
2 the Public Employees Retirement Board. The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall
3 establish by rule more than one overtime average for a class of state employees based on the ge-

14 employee of the community college that constitute a full-time equivalent in any discipline or aca-

17 and 10 of this 2007 Act apply to all service by members of the Public Employees Retirement
18 System, whether performed before, on or after the effective date of this 2007 Act.
