SUMMARY

Identifies facilities to be covered by Department of Human Services foodborne illness prevention program.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to foodborne illness prevention; amending ORS 624.495.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 624.495 is amended to read:

5 624.495. (1) The Department of Human Services shall adopt rules establishing a foodborne illness
6 prevention program for the purpose of protecting the public health. **Unless an agreement entered**
7 **into under ORS 624.530 provides otherwise**, the program may include, but need not be limited to,
8 provisions for preventing the spread of communicable disease through food [*dispensing*] **service** fa-
9 cilities **that are subject to licensing by the department under this chapter** and for effective and
10 rapid response to terrorism events related to [*food dispensing*] **those** facilities.

11 (2) A program established by the department under this section must provide for a local public
12 health authority that enters into an intergovernmental agreement under ORS 624.510 to undertake
13 primary responsibility for the delivery of program services within the jurisdiction of the local au-
14 thority. A program must also provide for extensive monitoring and review by the department of local
15 public health authority performance of program services under an intergovernmental agreement.

16 (3) The department shall consult with groups representing local health officials within the state
17 and statewide restaurant associations in the development of rules adopted under this section and
18 prior to preparing an intergovernmental agreement delegating administration and enforcement of all
19 or part of the foodborne illness prevention program to a local public health authority.
