5	SECTION 1. ORS 162.247 is amended to read:
6	162.247. (1) A person commits the crime of interfering with a peace officer or parole and pro-
7	bation officer if the person, knowing that another person is a peace officer or a parole and probation
8	officer as defined in ORS 181.610:
9	(a) Intentionally acts in a manner that prevents, or attempts to prevent, a peace officer or parole
10	and probation officer from performing the lawful duties of the officer with regards to another person;

12	[(b) Refuses to obey a lawful order by the peace officer or parole and probation officer.]
13	(b) Intentionally or knowingly enters or remains within a designated crime scene without
L 4	the permission of a peace officer; or
15	(c) Intentionally or knowingly interferes with a peace officer lawfully engaged in the in-
16	vestigation of a crime or traffic collision.
L7	(2) Interfering with a peace officer or parole and probation officer is a Class A misdemeanor.
18	(3) This section does not apply in situations in which the person is engaging [in]:
19	(a) In activity that would constitute resisting arrest under ORS 162.315; [or]
20	(b) In passive resistance; or
21	(c) Solely in constitutionally protected activity.
