SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Eliminates lack of foreseeability as defense in action for medical expenses against owner of dog that caused injury.

Relating to dogs.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. In any action for medical expenses arising from an injury caused by a dog, the owner of the dog may not assert as a defense that the owner could not foresee that the dog would cause the injury. This section does not prevent the owner of a dog that caused an injury from asserting that the dog was provoked, or from asserting any other defense that may be available to the owner.
