SUMMARY

Expands kidnapping in first degree to include kidnapping with purpose of committing or facilitating sex crime against victim.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2	Relating to kidnapping; amending ORS 163.235.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. ORS 163.235 is amended to read:
5	163.235. (1) A person commits the crime of kidnapping in the first degree if the person violates
6	ORS 163.225 with any of the following purposes:
7	(a) To compel any person to pay or deliver money or property as ransom;
8	(b) To hold the victim as a shield or hostage;
9	(c) To cause physical injury to the victim; [or]
10	(d) To terrorize the victim or another person[.]; or
11	(e) To commit or to facilitate the commission of any of the following crimes against the
12	person taken:
13	(A) Rape in the first degree as defined in ORS 163.375 (1)(a) or (d);
14	(B) Sodomy in the first degree as defined in ORS 163.405 (1)(a) or (d);
15	(C) Unlawful sexual penetration in the first degree as defined in ORS 163.411 (1)(a) or (c);
16	or
17	(D) Sexual abuse in the first degree as defined in ORS 163.427 (1).
18	(2) Kidnapping in the first degree is a Class A felony.
