House Bill 2464

Sponsored by Representatives HANNA, GELSER

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Directs Department of Human Services to adopt rules under which person with developmental disability receiving medical assistance and residential services from department may retain earned income and remain eligible for services.

Directs department to apply for federal waiver necessary to adopt rules.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to retention of earned income while maintaining eligibility for services for persons with a developmental disability; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. The Department of Human Services shall adopt rules to allow a person with a developmental disability receiving services from the department in a residential setting to retain, each month, an amount of earned income no less than \$65 and no more than \$320 while maintaining eligibility for state medical assistance and placement in a residential setting.

SECTION 2. (1) No later than January 1, 2008, the Department of Human Services shall apply for a waiver of federal requirements that the department determines necessary to allow a person with a developmental disability receiving services from the department in a residential setting to retain, each month, an amount of earned income no less than \$65 and no more than \$320 while maintaining eligibility for state medical assistance and placement in a residential setting.

(2) The department shall adopt rules implementing section 1 of this 2007 Act as soon as practicable after receipt of the necessary waiver.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect on its passage.
