

# House Bill 2500

Sponsored by Representative G SMITH; Representatives DALLUM, ESQUIVEL, GIROD, THATCHER, Senator L GEORGE (at the request of Christopher Jung)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Modifies qualification for tax credit for volunteer emergency medical technicians.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to tax credits; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 315.622.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

**SECTION 1.** ORS 315.622 is amended to read:

315.622. (1) A resident or nonresident individual who is certified as eligible under ORS 442.550 to 442.570 and who is certified as an emergency medical technician under ORS chapter 682 shall be allowed a credit against the taxes that are otherwise due under ORS chapter 316 if the Office of Rural Health certifies that the individual provides volunteer emergency medical technician services in a rural area that comprise at least 20 percent of the total **volunteer** emergency medical technician services provided by the individual in the tax year.

(2) The amount of the credit shall equal \$250.

(3) A nonresident shall be allowed the credit under this section in the proportion provided in ORS 316.117. If a change in the status of a taxpayer from resident to nonresident or from nonresident to resident occurs, the credit allowed by this section shall be determined in a manner consistent with ORS 316.117.

(4) As used in this section, "rural area" means a geographic area that is located at least 25 miles from any city with a population of 30,000 or more.

**SECTION 2.** The amendments to ORS 315.622 by section 1 of this 2007 Act apply to tax credit certifications issued by the Office of Rural Health on or after January 1, 2008, and before January 1, 2011.
