

# House Bill 2515

Sponsored by Representatives FLORES, LIM, Senator MONNES ANDERSON; Representatives BOQUIST, SCHAUFLE, G SMITH, Senators AVAKIAN, BROWN, BURDICK, METSGER, NELSON (at the request of Darla Sturdy in memory of Aaron Wagner Sturdy)

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires mass transit district or transportation district that operates light rail system to install crossing gates at unguarded pedestrian crossings of light rail tracks.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to light rail.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. To enhance the safety of mass transit system users, a mass transit district**  
5 **that operates a light rail system shall install crossing gates at each unguarded pedestrian**  
6 **crossing of the light rail tracks.**

7 **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2007 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 267.010 to**  
8 **267.390.**

9 **SECTION 3. To enhance the safety of system users, a transportation district that oper-**  
10 **ates a light rail system shall install crossing gates at each unguarded pedestrian crossing**  
11 **of the light rail tracks.**

12 **SECTION 4. Section 3 of this 2007 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 267.510 to**  
13 **267.650.**

14 **SECTION 5. (1) A mass transit district that operates a light rail system shall bring all**  
15 **light rail tracks into compliance with the requirements of section 1 of this 2007 Act within**  
16 **one year after the effective date of this 2007 Act.**

17 **(2) A transportation district that operates a light rail system shall bring all light rail**  
18 **tracks into compliance with the requirements of section 3 of this 2007 Act within one year**  
19 **after the effective date of this 2007 Act.**  
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**NOTE:** Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [*italic and bracketed*] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.
