SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Requires State Landscape Contractors Board to establish continuing education requirement for landscape contractors. Requires landscape contractors submitting applications to renew licenses expiring on or after January 1, 2009, to demonstrate compliance with continuing education requirement.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

5	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
6	SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2007 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 671.510 to
7	671.710.
8	SECTION 2. (1) The State Landscape Contractors Board shall adopt rules establishing
9	continuing education requirements for landscape contractors. The board may not require
10	landscape contractors to take more than 10 hours of continuing education every year.
11	(2) The board may approve programs for purposes of landscape contractor continuing
12	education and determine the number of hours to be credited to the programs. The board
13	shall ensure that continuing education opportunities for landscape contractors are readily
14	available.
15	(3) Programs approved by the board for continuing education purposes must be designed
16	to directly contribute to landscape contractor professional competency. Approved programs
17	may include, but need not be limited to:
18	(a) Professional development programs and technical meetings of professional associ-
19	ations for landscaping businesses or for related industries such as pesticide application or
20	irrigation auditing;
21	(b) University or college courses related to landscape contracting or horticulture;
22	(c) Professional staff training programs by landscape contractor associations; and
23	(d) Online or other forms of educational programs.
24	(4) The board may adopt rules establishing grounds for obtaining a waiver of landscape
25	contractor continuing education requirements. The board may not allow a waiver for more

1	than two consecutive years except for a waiver due to military service, retirement, disability,
2	absence from the state, inactive status or extreme hardship.

17	(a) Submit the name of the employer if the person is currently performing landscaping work;

19	(b) Demonstrate that the person has complied with the continuing education requirement
