House Bill 2590

Sponsored by Representative GREENLICK; Representative SHIELDS

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Directs Governor to appoint Drug Policy Coordinator. Specifies duties and functions of Drug Policy Coordinator.

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2 Relating to Drug Policy Coordinator.

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- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- SECTION 1. (1) The Governor shall appoint a Drug Policy Coordinator. The Drug Policy Coordinator shall perform the duties and functions specified in this section in the office of the Governor.
 - (2) The Drug Policy Coordinator shall meet at least once each month with the following public officials, or with designees of the following public officials:
 - (a) The Director of the Department of Corrections.
 - (b) The Superintendent of State Police.
 - (c) The Director of Human Services.
- (d) The Superintendent of Public Instruction.
- 13 (e) The Director of the Department of Environmental Quality.
- 14 (f) The Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries.
- 15 (g) The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court.
 - (3) The Drug Policy Coordinator shall consult and coordinate with local mental health authorities on local activities and initiatives relating to substance abuse treatment and prevention.
 - (4) The Drug Policy Coordinator shall periodically review all state agency expenditures, activities and initiatives relating to:
 - (a) Limiting illegal sales and use of methamphetamines and other controlled substances; and
 - (b) Providing substance abuse treatment and prevention.
 - (5) The Drug Policy Coordinator shall:
 - (a) Advise the Governor on expenditures, activities and initiatives that best promote the goals of limiting illegal sales and use of methamphetamines and other controlled substances and providing substance abuse treatment and prevention;
 - (b) Prepare an annual report to the Governor and the Legislative Assembly on the status of efforts to limit illegal sales and use of methamphetamines and other controlled substances and on the status of efforts to provide substance abuse treatment and prevention;
 - (c) Make recommendations for administrative changes within state agencies that would

- increase the effectiveness of expenditures, activities and initiatives directed to limiting illegal sales and use of methamphetamines and other controlled substances and directed to providing substance abuse treatment and prevention;
- (d) Make recommendations for legislation necessary to best implement state policies on limiting illegal sales and use of methamphetamines and other controlled substances and state policies on providing substance abuse treatment and prevention;
- (e) Make recommendations for changes in allocation of funding for activities and initiatives necessary to best implement state policies on limiting illegal sales and use of methamphetamines and other controlled substances and state policies on providing substance abuse treatment and prevention; and
 - (f) Carry out other duties relating to drug policies that may be assigned by the Governor.
- (6) The public officials specified in subsection (2) of this section shall assist the Drug Policy Coordinator in the performance of duties and functions specified in this section, and shall provide the Drug Policy Coordinator with all information necessary to the performance of those duties and functions except to the extent provision of the information is barred by other law.
