## House Bill 2622

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND LABOR

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Prohibits certain employees of Oregon Youth Authority from striking.

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT
2	Relating to the Oregon Youth Authority; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 243.736.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. ORS 243.736 is amended to read:
5	243.736. (1) It [shall be] is unlawful for any [emergency telephone worker, parole and probation
6	officer who supervises adult offenders, police officer, firefighter or guard at a correctional institution
7	or mental hospital] of the following public employees to strike or recognize a picket line of a labor
8	organization while in the performance of official duties:
9	(a) Emergency telephone worker;
10	(b) Employee of the Oregon Youth Authority who has custody, control or supervision of
11	youth offenders;
12	(c) Firefighter;
13	(d) Guard at a correctional institution or mental hospital;
14	(e) Parole and probation officer who supervises adult offenders; and
15	(f) Police officer.
16	(2) As used in this section, "emergency telephone worker" means a person whose official focal
17	duties are receiving information through a 9-1-1 emergency reporting system under ORS 401.710 to
18	401.816, relaying [such] the information to public or private safety agencies or dispatching emer-
19	gency equipment or personnel in response to [such] the information.
20	SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 243.736 by section 1 of this 2007 Act apply only to
21	collective bargaining agreements that involve employees of the Oregon Youth Authority who
22	have custody, control or supervision of youth offenders and that are entered into or extended
23	on or after the effective date of this 2007 Act.
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
