

HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2691

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after the semicolon delete the rest of the line and insert “creating
2 new provisions; and amending ORS 801.041.”.

3 Delete lines 4 through 17 and insert:

4 “**SECTION 1.** ORS 801.041 is amended to read:

5 “801.041. The following apply to the authority granted to counties by ORS 801.040 to establish
6 registration fees for vehicles:

7 “(1) **Notwithstanding ORS 203.055 or any provision of a county charter**, an ordinance es-
8 tablishing registration fees under this section must be enacted by the county imposing the registra-
9 tion fee and filed with the Department of Transportation. [*Any ordinance establishing registration*
10 *fees that is enacted by the governing body of a county must be submitted to the electors of the county*
11 *for their approval.*] The governing body of the county imposing the registration fee shall enter into
12 an intergovernmental agreement under ORS 190.010 with the department by which the department
13 shall collect the registration fees, pay them over to the county and, if necessary, allow the credit
14 or credits described in ORS 803.445 (5). The intergovernmental agreement must state the date on
15 which the department shall begin collecting registration fees for the county.

16 “(2) The authority granted by this section allows the establishment of registration fees in addi-
17 tion to those described in ORS 803.420. There is no authority under this section to affect registration
18 periods, qualifications, cards, plates, requirements or any other provision relating to vehicle regis-
19 tration under the vehicle code.

20 “(3) Except as otherwise provided for in this subsection, when registration fees are imposed
21 under this section, they must be imposed on all vehicle classes. Registration fees as provided under
22 this section may not be imposed on the following:

23 “(a) Snowmobiles and Class I all-terrain vehicles.

24 “(b) Fixed load vehicles.

25 “(c) Vehicles registered under ORS 805.100 to disabled veterans.

26 “(d) Vehicles registered as antique vehicles under ORS 805.010.

27 “(e) Vehicles registered as vehicles of special interest under ORS 805.020.

28 “(f) Government-owned or operated vehicles registered under ORS 805.040 or 805.045.

29 “(g) School buses or school activity vehicles registered under ORS 805.050.

30 “(h) Law enforcement undercover vehicles registered under ORS 805.060.

31 “(i) Vehicles registered on a proportional basis for interstate operation.

32 “(j) Vehicles with a registration weight of 26,001 pounds or more described in ORS 803.420 (10)
33 or (11).

34 “(k) Vehicles registered as farm vehicles under the provisions of ORS 805.300.

35 “(L) Travel trailers, campers and motor homes.

1 “(4) Any registration fee imposed by a county must be a fixed amount not to exceed, with re-
2 spect to any vehicle class, the registration fee established under ORS 803.420 (1). For vehicles on
3 which a flat fee is imposed under ORS 803.420, the fee must be a whole dollar amount.

4 “(5) Moneys from registration fees established under this section must be paid to the county
5 establishing the registration fees as provided in ORS 802.110. The county ordinance shall provide for
6 payment of at least 40 percent of the money to cities within the county unless a different distrib-
7 ution is agreed to between the county and the cities within the jurisdiction of the county. The
8 moneys shall be used for any purpose for which moneys from registration fees may be used.

9 “(6) Two or more counties may act jointly to impose a registration fee under this section. The
10 ordinance of each county acting jointly with another under this subsection must provide for the
11 distribution of moneys collected through a joint registration fee.

12 “(7) Before the governing body of a county that overlaps a district can impose a registration fee
13 under this section, it must enter into an intergovernmental agreement under ORS 190.010 with the
14 governing bodies of that district and all counties, other districts and cities with populations of over
15 300,000 that overlap the district. The intergovernmental agreement must state the registration fees
16 and, if necessary, how the revenue from the fees are to be apportioned among the counties and the
17 districts. Before the governing body of a county can enter into such an intergovernmental agree-
18 ment, the county shall consult with the cities in its jurisdiction.

19 “**SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 801.041 by section 1 of this 2007 Act apply to or-**
20 **dinances enacted by the governing body of a county on or after the effective date of this 2007**
21 **Act.”.**
