House Bill 2730

Sponsored by Representative DALLUM, Senator NELSON; Representatives ESQUIVEL, SCHAUFLER, Senator DECKERT

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires that city with population greater than 100,000 include within its urban growth boundary certain tracts of land that are within corporate limits of city.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to inclusion of land within urban growth boundary of cities with population greater than 100,000; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. (1) Notwithstanding ORS 197.298, a city with a population greater than 100,000 shall, within six months after the effective date of this 2007 Act, include within its urban growth boundary a tract of land that is within the corporate limits of the city on the effective date of this 2007 Act if the tract is:
- 9 (a) Capable of being served by public utilities providing electricity, water and sewer ser-10 vice;
 - (b) Not less than 70 acres nor more than 200 acres in size; and
 - (c) Contiguous to the urban growth boundary.
 - (2) As used in this section:
 - (a) "Tract" has the meaning given that term in ORS 215.010.
 - (b) "Urban growth boundary" has the meaning given that term in ORS 195.060.
 - SECTION 2. An act by a city that includes a tract of land within an urban growth boundary under section 1 of this 2007 Act is not:
 - (1) A land use decision or a limited land use decision reviewable by the Land Use Board of Appeals under ORS 197.805 to 197.855 and 197.860; or
 - (2) Subject to review under ORS 197.610 to 197.650.
 - <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect on its passage.
