SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Directs Superintendent of Public Instruction to contract for development of kindergarten through grade 12 Mandarin Chinese language curriculum.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Education for contract. Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2007.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to Chinese language instruction; appropriating money; and declaring an emergency.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall contract with any entity

5 the superintendent determines is qualified to undertake the development of an articulated

6 kindergarten through grade 12 Mandarin Chinese language curriculum for public schools. The

7 development of the curriculum shall involve:

8 (a) Creating a network of Mandarin Chinese language teachers able to develop second 9 language kindergarten through grade 12 curricula, materials, assessments and best practices 10 needed to provide Mandarin Chinese language instruction to students, including evaluation 11 of the use of video technology for instruction by Mandarin Chinese language teachers in 12 foreign nations; and

(b) Coordinating statewide efforts to develop and expand Mandarin Chinese language instruction so that it is uniformly available to students throughout this state, and making innovative use of media and technology, including television, distance learning and online courses, to broaden students' access to the instruction.

17 (2) The entity with which the superintendent contracts under this section must have 18 sufficient knowledge and expertise to ensure the professional development of appropriate 19 high quality curricula, supplementary materials, aligned assessments and best practices that 20 accommodate different levels of student ability and types of programs.

(3) The superintendent, in conjunction with the entity with which the superintendent
contracts, must:

(a) Develop curricula, supplementary materials, aligned assessments and best practices;
and

(b) Make curricula, supplementary materials, aligned assessments and best practices
equitably available to Oregon schools and students.

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SECTION 2. The entity with which the Superintendent of Public Instruction contracts 1 2 under section 1 of this 2007 Act must work with a network of Mandarin Chinese language teachers to: 3 (1) Conduct an inventory of Mandarin Chinese language curricula, supplementary mate-4 rials and professional development initiatives currently used in Oregon or other states; 5 (2) Develop Mandarin Chinese language curricula and benchmarks aligned to second lan-6 guage standards and assessments; and 7 (3) Review and recommend to the superintendent how best to build an educational 8 9 infrastructure to provide more students with Mandarin Chinese language instruction, including how to develop and provide: 10 (a) An adequate supply of Mandarin Chinese language teachers; 11 12(b) An adequate number of high quality school programs; (c) Appropriate curricula, instructional materials and aligned assessments that include 13 technology-based delivery systems; 14 15 (d) Teacher preparation programs to train Mandarin Chinese language teachers; 16 (e) Expedited licensing of Mandarin Chinese language teachers; (f) Best practices in existing educational programs that can be used to establish 17 18 kindergarten through grade 12 Mandarin Chinese language programs; and 19 (g) Technical assistance resources. SECTION 3. There is appropriated to the Department of Education, for the biennium 20beginning July 1, 2007, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$350,000 for the purpose of 2122carrying out the provisions of section 1 of this 2007 Act. 23SECTION 4. This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect 2425July 1, 2007.

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
