"SECTION 1. (1) The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall contract with any entity

On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 30 and delete page 2 and insert:

3	the superintendent determines is qualified to undertake the development of an articulated
4	kindergarten through grade 12 Mandarin Chinese language curriculum for public schools. The
5	development of the curriculum shall involve:
6	"(a) Creating a network of Mandarin Chinese language teachers able to develop second
7	language kindergarten through grade 12 curricula, materials, assessments and best practices
8	needed to provide Mandarin Chinese language instruction to students, including evaluation
9	of the use of video technology for instruction by Mandarin Chinese language teachers in
10	foreign nations; and
11	"(b) Coordinating statewide efforts to develop and expand Mandarin Chinese language
12	instruction so that it is uniformly available to students throughout this state, and making
13	innovative use of media and technology, including television, distance learning and online
14	courses, to broaden students' access to the instruction.
15	"(2) The entity with which the superintendent contracts under this section must have
16	sufficient knowledge and expertise to ensure the professional development of appropriate
17	high quality curricula, supplementary materials, aligned assessments and best practices that
18	accommodate different levels of student ability and types of programs.
19	"(3) The superintendent, in conjunction with the entity with which the superintendent
20	contracts, must:
21	"(a) Develop curricula, supplementary materials, aligned assessments and best practices;
22	and
23	"(b) Make curricula, supplementary materials, aligned assessments and best practices
24	equitably available to Oregon schools and students.
25	"SECTION 2. The entity with which the Superintendent of Public Instruction contracts
26	under section 1 of this 2007 Act must work with a network of Mandarin Chinese language
27	teachers to:
28	"(1) Conduct an inventory of Mandarin Chinese language curricula, supplementary ma-
29	terials and professional development initiatives currently used in Oregon or other states;
30	"(2) Develop Mandarin Chinese language curricula and benchmarks aligned to second
31	language standards and assessments; and
32	"(3) Review and recommend to the superintendent how best to build an educational
33	infrastructure to provide more students with Mandarin Chinese language instruction, in-
34	cluding how to develop and provide:

"(a) An adequate supply of Mandarin Chinese language teachers;

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- "(b) An adequate number of high quality school programs;
- "(c) Appropriate curricula, instructional materials and aligned assessments that include technology-based delivery systems;
 - "(d) Teacher preparation programs to train Mandarin Chinese language teachers;
 - "(e) Expedited licensing of Mandarin Chinese language teachers;
- "(f) Best practices in existing educational programs that can be used to establish kindergarten through grade 12 Mandarin Chinese language programs; and
 - "(g) Technical assistance resources.

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- "SECTION 3. There is appropriated to the Department of Education, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$350,000 for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of section 1 of this 2007 Act.
- "SECTION 4. This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect July 1, 2007.".

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
