## House Bill 2784

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Requires that school districts perform oral health screenings on each pupil upon pupil's first enrollment in school. Requires consent of parent or guardian.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2007.

1	1	Α	BILL	FOR	AN	ACT

- 2 Relating to oral health screenings; creating new provisions; amending ORS 336.375, 336.400 and 336.410; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
  - SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2007 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 336.375 to 336.420.
  - SECTION 2. (1) A district school board shall conduct an oral health screening program. The program is intended to provide an oral health screening of each pupil at the time of the pupil's first enrollment in a public school in the school district.
  - (2) A district school board may furnish necessary instruments and equipment for the oral health screenings and provide suitable quarters in which the screenings may be performed.
  - (3) A district school board shall adopt a policy to implement the program. The policy shall incorporate the oral health screening policies of the Oregon Board of Dentistry.
  - (4) The oral health screenings may be furnished by the district school board free of expense to the minor pupils whose parents or guardians are unable to pay for the screenings and to the pupils who have attained the age of majority who are unable to pay for the screenings. Any charges made by the board for the screenings shall be fair and reasonable.
  - (5) A minor pupil may not be required or permitted to have an oral health screening without the written consent of the parent or guardian of the minor pupil. A pupil who has attained the age of majority is required to have a screening.

SECTION 3. ORS 336.375 is amended to read:

- 336.375. As used in ORS 336.375 to 336.420[,]:
- (1) "Dental health program" means a program whereby a dental examination is made at least once each school year of each pupil attending school in the district at the time of the examination and whereby dental treatment may be provided, subject to the rules of the district school board.
- (2) "Oral health screening" means a program in which a brief, visual observation of and report about a pupil's mouth and teeth are made by a person acting in accordance with the written oral health screening policies of the Oregon Board of Dentistry.
  - **SECTION 4.** ORS 336.400 is amended to read:
- 336.400. The result of the dental examination or the oral health screening shall be reported in writing to the parent or guardian of any pupil who, in the opinion of the person making the ex-

- amination, requires dental treatment. If, after receiving the report, the parent or guardian elects to have the recommended treatment performed by a dentist of the parent or guardian's own choosing, that dentist shall supply a certificate attesting that the treatment was performed in accordance with the report from the dental health program or the oral health screening program. The content of the certificate shall be recorded by the district school board.
  - **SECTION 5.** ORS 336.410 is amended to read:

- 336.410. [No] A school district [shall be] is not liable to any pupil, or to the parents or guardian of any pupil, for or on account of any claim for damage on account of any action by any person in connection with the district's dental health program or oral health screening program.
- SECTION 6. Section 2 of this 2007 Act applies to children first enrolling in a school for the 2007-2008 school year.
- <u>SECTION 7.</u> This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect July 1, 2007.
