House Bill 2815

Sponsored by Representative BOQUIST

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Expands eligibility for appointment as Adjutant General.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to Adjutant General appointments; amending ORS 396.150.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 396.150 is amended to read:

 $\mathbf{5}$ 396.150. (1) The Governor shall appoint [an] the Adjutant General, who [shall hold] holds office for a four-year term or until relieved by reason of resignation[, withdrawal of federal recognition] 6 7 or for cause to be determined by a court-martial. The current term of [an] the Adjutant General 8 shall continue until its prescribed expiration date [while such] if the Adjutant General is serving in 9 a federal active duty status under an order [or call by] of the President of the United States. By 10 voluntarily entering into [Voluntary entry onto] extended active duty, [by a person holding the of-11 fice of the Adjutant General automatically resigns from office [shall be an automatic resignation 12of such officer]. (2) To be eligible for appointment to the office of Adjutant General, a person must be an active, 13 retired or reserve officer of the [Oregon National Guard] Armed Forces of the United States, 14 15[federally recognized] in the grade of lieutenant colonel or higher, and must have completed at least six years' service as an officer in the [Oregon National Guard as a federally recognized officer] ac-16 tive or reserve Armed Forces of the United States. 17

(3) The Adjutant General [may] shall be appointed in the grade of lieutenant colonel or higher,
but not exceeding that of major general. [If appointed in a lower grade, the Adjutant General may
be promoted by the Governor to any grade not exceeding that of major general, to serve in such grade
only upon receipt of federal recognition therein.]

(4) In making an appointment under this section, the Governor may give preference to
 a current or retired member of the Oregon National Guard.
