House Bill 2923

Sponsored by JOINT COMMITTEE ON EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS AND OCEAN POLICY

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Appropriates moneys to Office of Emergency Management to establish or enhance programs providing public education and planning for emergency preparedness and response.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2007.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to emergency preparedness; appropriating money; and declaring an emergency.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. (1) The Legislative Assembly declares that:
 - (a) The terrorist events of September 11, 2001, and the events and aftermath that accompanied Hurricane Katrina have demonstrated a clear and undeniable need for effective emergency preparedness, response, recovery and mitigation efforts.
 - (b) Preparation involves hundreds of coordinative elements and actions to address the numerous potential hazards Oregonians face.
 - (c) To improve the ability to prepare for, respond to and recover from these hazards requires improved coordination with cities and counties.
 - (2) The Office of Emergency Management shall establish or enhance programs:
 - (a) Providing public education and outreach to address awareness and preparedness for natural disasters, including earthquakes, tsunamis and flooding.
 - (b) Providing planning assistance to cities and counties for emergencies, as defined in ORS 401.025, including issues relating to special needs populations.
 - (c) Maintaining and improving preemergency mitigation planning and preparation with cities and counties.
 - (d) Providing leadership and coordination for long-term recovery issues and overall logistics strategies.
 - (3) Under the direction of the Director of the Office of Emergency Management, the office shall employ:
 - (a) Five full-time equivalent regionally dispersed employees to implement subsection (2)(b) of this section.
 - (b) Two full-time equivalent employees to implement subsection (2)(c) of this section.
 - (c) Two full-time equivalent employees to implement subsection (2)(d) of this section.
 - SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropriated to the Office of Emergency Management, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, out of the General Fund, the amount of \$1,800,000, for the purpose of implementing section 1 of this 2007 Act.
 - SECTION 3. This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

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peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect July 1, 2007.

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
