## House Bill 2960

Sponsored by Representative GREENLICK, Senator AVAKIAN; Representative KOTEK

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Land Conservation and Development Commission to review and consider Forest Park for possible designation as area of critical state concern. Directs commission to report to legislative committee indicating whether commission recommends designation and to make further recommendations for park and related area of influence.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to land use planning for large urban parks.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 **<u>SECTION 1.</u>** (1) As used in this section:

5 (a) "Area of influence" means land that contributes to the natural and open space values

6 of Forest Park, including wildlife and riparian corridors.

7 (b) "Forest Park" means Portland's Forest Park, including the Balch Creek watershed.

8 (c) "Local government" has the meaning given that term in ORS 197.015.

9 (d) "Special district" has the meaning given that term in ORS 197.015.

10 (2) The Land Conservation and Development Commission shall review and consider For-

11 est Park for possible designation as an area of critical state concern. Based on the review,

12 the commission shall report to the Joint Legislative Committee on Land Use or other ap-

propriate legislative committee. The report must indicate whether the commission recommends that the Legislative Assembly designate Forest Park and the area of influence as an

15 area of critical state concern pursuant to ORS 197.405.

(3) In making the recommendations required by subsection (2) of this section, the com mission shall:

(a) Determine, in cooperation with local governments and special districts with jurisdic tion over the land area in Forest Park and the area of influence, and describe in its recom-

20 mendations the precise boundaries of Forest Park and the area of influence;

(b) Evaluate whether the regional framework plan and applicable comprehensive plans
 preserve the natural and open space values of Forest Park; and

23 (c) Summarize the local, regional and state:

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24 (A) Programs that apply to Forest Park and the area of influence; and

(B) Policies and measures that apply to the identified natural and open space values of
 Forest Park.

27 (4) In performing the actions required by this section, the commission shall consult with

28 other appropriate entities including, but not limited to, members of the public, affected state

29 agencies, local governments and special districts.

30 (5) To offset costs incurred by local governments assisting the commission in performing

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1 the requirements of this section, the commission shall make available to local governments

2 grant funds as described in ORS 197.639.

3 (6) The commission shall make the recommendations required by subsection (2) of this
4 section to the Joint Legislative Committee on Land Use, or other appropriate legislative
5 committee, within two years after the effective date of this 2007 Act.

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
