SUMMARY

Adds misdemeanors involving physical injury or deadly weapons to offenses that must be reported to Department of State Police Bureau of Criminal Identification.

(1) The following crimes are crimes for which criminal offender information must be 5 6 provided: 7 [(1)] (a) Any felony; 8 [(2)] (b) Any misdemeanor or other offense which involves criminal sexual conduct; [or] 9 [(3)] (c) Any crime which involves a violation of the Uniform Controlled Substances Act[.]; or (d) A misdemeanor which involves use or attempted use of physical force or threatened 10 use of deadly weapon. 11 12 (2) The offenses to which subsection (1)(d) of this section applies are: 13 (a) Assault in the fourth degree; (b) Strangulation; 14 (c) Disorderly conduct; 15 (d) Harassment; 16 17 (e) Pointing firearm at another; (f) Unlawful possession of a firearm; and 18 (g) Criminal trespass while in possession of a firearm. 19
