## House Bill 3176

Sponsored by Representative NELSON; Representatives BARKER, SHIELDS, WITT (at the request of J. Graigory for "Dalton's Law")

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires motor vehicle telematics service provider to furnish information about location of motor vehicle to law enforcement agency upon request.

Imposes civil penalty not to exceed \$\_\_\_\_\_ for failure to provide requested information.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to motor vehicle telematics service providers.

**3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 **SECTION 1. (1)** As used in this section:

5 (a) "Law enforcement agency" means:

6 (A) A city or municipal police department.

7 (B) A county sheriff's office.

8 (C) The Oregon State Police.

9 (b) "Motor vehicle telematics" means the transmission of data from systems and devices

in a motor vehicle to a motor vehicle telematics service provider to allow tracking of the motor vehicle by the motor vehicle telematics service provider using global positioning system satellites and cellular technology.

(c) "Motor vehicle telematics service provider" means an entity that provides motor ve hicle telematics services to owners of motor vehicles equipped with motor vehicle telematics.

(2) If a law enforcement agency has probable cause to believe that a crime has been committed and that locating a motor vehicle will assist in the investigation of the crime, the law enforcement agency may request that a motor vehicle telematics service provider provide the location of the motor vehicle.

(3) A motor vehicle telematics service provider shall provide the location of a motor ve hicle upon the request of a law enforcement agency as provided in subsection (2) of this
section.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) The Attorney General may impose a civil penalty against a motor vehicle
telematics service provider that fails to provide information requested under section 1 of this
2007 Act. The civil penalty may not exceed \$\_\_\_\_\_\_ for each violation.

(2) Civil penalties under this section shall be imposed as provided in ORS 183.745.

(3) All penalties recovered under this section shall be paid into the State Treasury and
credited to the General Fund.
