House Bill 3189

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates offense of operating motor vehicle while using mobile communication device. Applies to persons under 18 years of age. Punishes by maximum fine of \$90.

2	Relating to use of mobile communication device while driving.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2007 Act is added to and made a part of the Oregon Vehicle
5	Code.
6	SECTION 2. (1) A person under 18 years of age commits the offense of operating a motor
7	vehicle while using a mobile communication device if the person, while operating a motor
8	vehicle on a highway, uses a mobile communication device but does not use a hands-free
9	accessory.
10	(2) For purposes of this section:
11	(a) "Hands-free accessory" means an attachment or built-in feature for or an addition
12	to a mobile communication device, whether or not permanently installed in a motor vehicle,
13	that when used allows a person to maintain both hands on the steering wheel.
14	(b) "Mobile communication device" means a text messaging device or a wireless, two-way
15	communication device designed to receive and transmit voice communication.
16	(3) This section does not apply to:
17	(a) A person operating an ambulance or emergency vehicle; or
18	(b) A person summoning medical or other emergency help if no other person in the ve-
19	hicle is capable of summoning help.
20	(4) The offense described in this section, operating a motor vehicle while using a mobile
21	communication device, is a Class D traffic violation.
