## House Bill 3214

Sponsored by Representative NELSON

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## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Creates Task Force on Zero-based Budgeting. Directs task force to study Department of Human Services and Economic and Community Development Department to determine effect of zero-based budget.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to a study of zero-based budgeting; and declaring an emergency.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) There is created the Task Force on Zero-based Budgeting consisting of 5 12 members appointed as follows:
  - (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint:
- 7 (A) Three members from among members of the Senate;
- 8 (B) Two members who are certified public accountants; and
- 9 (C) One member who is an industrial engineer.
- 10 (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint:
- 11 (A) Three members from among members of the House of Representatives;
- 12 (B) Two members who are certified public accountants; and
- 13 (C) One member who is an industrial engineer.
  - (2) The task force shall study the Department of Human Services and the Economic and Community Development Department to determine how a zero-based, performance evaluated budget would affect each department.
  - (3) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
  - (4) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members of the task force. The task force by official action may recommend legislation and all legislation recommended by the task force must indicate that it is introduced at the request of the task force. Such legislation shall be prepared in time for presession filing by December 15, 2008, for presentation to the regular session of the Seventy-fifth Legislative Assembly.
    - (5) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.
  - (6) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.
  - (7) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task force.
    - (8) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.
    - (9) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall provide staff support to the

task force.

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- (10) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing functions of the task force shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services for that purpose.
- (11) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.
- (12) As used in this section, "zero-based budgeting" means budgeting that begins with the assumption that initial funding amounts for each component of a budget are zero and that contains justification for all proposed expenditures.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2007 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the next regular biennial legislative session.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect on its passage.
