SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Allows members of Oregon National Guard to enroll in specified classes at state institution of higher education or community college at no cost.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2007.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to education benefits for members of Oregon National Guard; and declaring an emergency.
 - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - **SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:**
 - (a) "Limited enrollment class" means a class in which enrollment is limited to a specified number of students.
 - (b) "Member of the Oregon National Guard" means a person who is:
 - (A) An active or retired member of the Oregon National Guard; and
- 9 (B) A resident of Oregon.
 - (2) If a state institution of higher education or a community college offers a limited enrollment class and the specified number of students have not enrolled in the class by the enrollment deadline, the remaining unfilled spaces in the class shall be offered at no cost to members of the Oregon National Guard.
 - (3) A member of the Oregon National Guard may enroll in the limited enrollment class upon proof of membership in the Oregon National Guard.
 - (4) A member of the Oregon National Guard may enroll in one or more limited enrollment classes even if the member is not enrolled at the state institution of higher education or the community college as a full-time or part-time student.
 - SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2007 Act first applies to the 2007-2008 school year.
 - SECTION 3. This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect July 1, 2007.
