House Bill 3343

Sponsored by Representatives HUNT, BURLEY; Representatives BARKER, FLORES, SCHAUFLER, THATCHER

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Authorizes school districts to site school on tract of land within three miles of urban growth boundary without adopting exception to statewide land use planning goal.

Authorizes city or district within county to extend specified urban services to school, notwithstanding statewide land use planning goal relating to public facilities and services.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to siting public schools outside urban growth boundaries.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) As used in this section, "school district" means a common school district or a union high school district as those terms are defined in ORS 330.005.
 - (2) Without adopting an exception pursuant to ORS 197.732, a school district may site a school providing education for prekindergarten through grade 12 on a tract, as defined in ORS 215.010, of high-value farmland within three miles of an urban growth boundary in the county.
 - (3) Notwithstanding a statewide land use planning goal relating to urban and rural public facilities and services, with the approval of the governing body of the city or the district, a city or a district that provides urban services, as defined in ORS 195.065, within an urban growth area may extend sanitary sewer and water services beyond the urban growth boundary to serve a school authorized in subsection (2) of this section.

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
