## House Bill 3356

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON WORKFORCE AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Establishes task force to study population growth forecasts and public infrastructure needs through year 2050 and revenue needs to support population growth and infrastructure needs. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to management of population growth; and declaring an emergency.
  - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
  - <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) There is created the 2050 Task Force on Future Growth, consisting of 30 members appointed as follows:
- 6 (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint two members from among members of the 7 Senate.
  - (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two members from among members of the House of Representatives.
  - (c) The Governor shall appoint 26 members who are knowledgeable in areas including, but not limited to, population forecasting, economic development, housing, education, public infrastructure development, including transportation and education infrastructure, and public borrowing.
  - (2) The task force shall review population forecasts to project growth and infrastructure needs through the year 2050 and evaluate the need for revenues, including borrowed moneys, that will be required to meet the need for public infrastructure through the year 2050.
  - (3) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction of business.
  - (4) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members of the task force.
    - (5) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson.
  - (6) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appointment to become immediately effective.
  - (7) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task force.
    - (8) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force.
  - (9) The task force shall submit a report, and may include recommendations for legislation, to an interim committee related to population growth management as appropriate no later than October 1, 2008.
  - (10) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services shall provide staff support to the task force.

**NOTE:** Matter in **boldfaced** type in an amended section is new; matter [italic and bracketed] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in **boldfaced** type.

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- (11) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. The department shall pay claims for expenses incurred in performing functions of the task force out of funds appropriated to the department for that purpose.
- (12) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force consider necessary to perform their duties.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2007 Act is repealed on the date of the convening of the next regular biennial legislative session.

SECTION 3. This 2007 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2007 Act takes effect on its passage.
